23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

25 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department

28 programs of the Department of Education for the fiscal year ending June 30,

1 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of
 2 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying
 3 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the

15 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 17 DISBURSEMENT PROCEDURES. The State Board of Education shall develop rules and
 18 regulations for disbursement of the funds in a manner that insures equity in
 19 meeting the provisions of the nurse to student ratio established in Arkansas
 20 Code 6-18-706.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~

 24 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

 26 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1
 27 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for ~~that~~
 28 ~~appropriation- Isolated Funding~~ that is not utilized shall be transferred to
 29 the appropriation for Special Needs Isolated Funding in Section 1 of this Act
 30 and shall be used there for fully funding each subsection (c) through (f) of
 31 ~~A.C.A. Arkansas Code §6-20-604 continuing sequentially by subsection~~ on a pro
 32 rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. If any funding and

4 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO
6 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School
7 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a
8 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state
9 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district
10 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is
11 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir
12 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend
13 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to
14 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or
15 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school
16 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the
17 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act
18 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating
19 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The
20 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such
21 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department
22 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation
23 as is deemed necessary.

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~
25 2009 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2010.

27 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
29 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special
30 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide
31 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such
32 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are
33 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of
34 special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute
35 such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~

3 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
5 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each
6 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time
7 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
8 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the
9 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation
10 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State
11 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-
12 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount
13 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public
14 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or
15 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public
16 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".

17

18 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
20 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
21 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
22 established by the State Board of Education.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~
24 2009 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2010.

25

26 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
28 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
29 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
30 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~
32 2009 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2010.

33

34 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
36 AUTHORITY. The Director of the Department of Education, with the approval of

1 the Chief Fiscal Officer and after approval by the Arkansas Legislative
2 Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to request necessary
3 appropriation transfers and any other budget related adjustments necessary.
4 Provided, however, that the Department of Education shall be limited to
5 submitting no more than two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

6 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
7 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
8 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
9 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
10 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
11 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
12 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently
13 if some flexibility is provided to the Director of the Department of
14 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision
15 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General
16 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
17 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The
18 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
19 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by
20 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional
21 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~
23 2009 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2010.

24

25 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN
27 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds
28 authorized herein to the Department of Education - for the Quiz Bowl each
29 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each
30 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -
31 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the
32 Quiz Bowl.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~
34 2009 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2010.

35

36 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
2 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education
3 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation
4 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal
5 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred
6 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for
7 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five
8 hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, and
9 ~~five~~ ten thousand dollars ~~(\$5,000)~~ (\$10,000) each fiscal year for the State
10 History Day Competition. The Department of Education shall allocate General
11 Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred thirty ~~two~~ seven thousand
12 dollars ~~(\$132,000)~~ (\$137,000) each fiscal year from the Department of
13 Education Public School Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the
14 Quiz Bowl, the Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 each for
15 students and chaperones, Destination Imagination, and the State History Day
16 Competition. The Department shall either expend or have committed for
17 expenditure the monies allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Creativity in Arkansas,
18 Inc., Destination Imagination, and the State History Day Competition as
19 authorized herein in order to fulfill the provisions of this section.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~
21 2009 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2010.

22

23 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EAST
25 FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants
26 each fiscal year, an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000)
27 or eighteen percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be
28 awarded through a grant or professional services contract for EAST
29 infrastructure, personnel, and operating expenses. The EAST infrastructure
30 grant or contract for personal services and operating expenses shall be
31 awarded to an entity that has personnel or experience, or both, in
32 implementing the EAST Initiative.

27 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
28 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
29 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
30 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of
31 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
32 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
33 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2009 could work irreparable harm upon the
34 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
35 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
36 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and

1 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2009.
