- 18 FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants
- 19 each fiscal year, an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000)
- 20 or eighteen percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be
- 21 awarded through a grant or professional services contract for EAST
- 22 infrastructure, personnel, and operating expenses. The EAST infrastructure

- 33 Education shall make available one hundred eighty seven thousand five hundred
- 34 seventy five dollars (\$187,575) each fiscal year for Explor-Net Program
- 35 Center for Quality Teaching and Learning initiatives to teach students
- 36 computer repair in a hands-on environment. The Department of Education shall

- 34 and implement statewide professional development support systems for teachers

The Department of Education is hereby 22 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for 23 administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds 24 shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to 25 ensure compliance with programmatic standards. - 21 submit this data annually to the National Education Association in accordance
- 22 with that organization's deadlines for submission for their report "Rankings
- 23 and Estimates" which includes state-by-state teacher salary comparisons.

- 25 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
- 27 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Arkansas Better
- 28 Chance for School Success Program remaining on June 30, 2008 2010 and June
- 29 30, 2009, in the Department of Education Public School Fund Account shall be
- 30 designated and retained for the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success
- 31 Program.
- 32 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of $\frac{\text{appropriation and/or}}{\text{or}}$ funding as
- 33 authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:
- 34 (1) Prior to June 30, 2008 2010 and June 30, 2009 the Agency shall by
- 35 written statement set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said
- 36 appropriation and/or funding to the Department of Finance and Administration

- 1 Office of Budget;
- 2 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall
- 3 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward—from

10	in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval,
11	could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of
12	essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared
13	to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
14	public peace, health, and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
15	after July 1, 2009; with the exception that SECTION 6 in this Act shall be in
16	full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
