LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 36 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

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in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

8 SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 9 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of 10 the Department of Health are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient 11 for the Department of Health to continue to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies 12 13 for the Department of Health to continue such services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper 14 15 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, 16 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the 17 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. 18 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become 19 20 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor 21 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 22 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides 23 the veto. 24 25 26 27 28 29

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
