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           SECTION 3. Arkansas Code §§ 3-5-1405 - 3-5-1412 are amended to read as
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     follows:
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           3-5-1405. Licenses - Scope - Restrictions.
                The Director of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division may issue
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a license for a licensee:

1	(1) To operate a small brewery that:		
2	(A) Manufactures at its licensed facility:		
3	$\underline{\text{(i)}}$ no $\underline{\text{No}}$ less than thirty-five percent (35%) of its		
4	beer and malt beverages to be sold in the state and no more than sixty		
5	thousand (60,000) barrels per year; or		
6	(ii) purchases Purchases from a producer brewery		
7	beer or malt beverages in an aggregate quantity not to exceed sixty thousand		
8	(60,000) barrels per year;		
9	(B) Sells to wholesale or to the consumer for consumption		
10	either on or off the premises brand name products of the licensed facility $\underline{\text{or}}$		
11	another small brewery; and		
12	(C) Stores any beer and malt beverages legally purchased		
13	for resale on the premises;		
14	(D) Serves on the premises or at small brewery off-		
15	premises retail sites complimentary samples of beer produced by the small		
16	brewery or another licensed small brewery, if the small brewery or its off-		
17	premises retail sites are located in a wet territory;		
18	(E) Sells at retail by the drink or by the package beer		
19	produced on the premises of the small brewery or produced by another small		
20	brewery if all sales occur in a wet territory and at:		
21	(i) The small brewery off-premises retail sites; or		
22	(ii)(a) Fairs and food and beer festivals, with the		
23	permission and the consent of the management of the events.		
24	(b) A sales and use tax permit also is		
25	required for sales under this subdivision (a)(1)(E)(ii);		
26	(F)(i) Sells and transports beer produced on the premises		
27	of the small brewery or of another small brewery to wholesale and retail		
28	license holders and small brewery license holders.		
29	(ii) To sell and transport beer under subdivision		
30	(a)(l)(F)(i) of this section, the small brewery shall obtain a beer wholesale		
31	permit; and		
32	(G) Sell for consumption on the premises of the small		
33	brewery beer produced by the small brewery or another small brewery and		
34	purchased by the drink or by the package at the licensed premises, if the		
35	small brewery is located in a wet territory; or		
36	(2) To operate a microbrewery-restaurant that:		

- 1 (A) Manufactures beer and malt beverages in an aggregate 2
- quantity not to exceed five thousand (5,000) barrels per year;
- 3 (B)(i) Sells to wholesale or retail dealers or to the 4 consumer for consumption either on or off the premises.
- 5 (ii) However, off-premise sales are limited to brand 6 name products of the licensed facility or another small brewery; and
- 7 (C) Stores any beer and malt beverages purchased for 8 resale on the premises.
- 9 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, 10 beer and malt beverages may be sold for on-premises or off-premises 11 consumption during all legal operating hours in which business is normally 12 and legally conducted on the premises, if:
 - The brewery provides tours through its facility; and
 - Only sealed containers are removed from the premises.

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- 15 (c)(1) A native small brewery may provide beer and malt beverages it 16 manufactures to charitable or nonprofit organizations or sell for resale beer 17 and malt beverages it manufactures to charitable or nonprofit organizations 18 holding valid special event permits issued by the Alcoholic Beverage Control 19 Board.
 - (2) The sale of those products is limited to the duration of the particular special event.
- 22 (d) Any person holding a valid microbrewery-restaurant license is 23 considered a native small brewery licensee that maintains production limits 24 according to the definition of microbrewery-restaurant in § 3-5-1403.
 - 3-5-1406. Additional license to sell native small brewery beer and malt beverages not required.
 - (a) Any wholesale or retail dealer that is licensed to sell beer and malt beverages may sell beer and malt beverages produced by native brewers a small brewery without any additional license fee.
- 31 (b) Any retail dealer not licensed to sell beer and malt beverages may 32 sell beer and malt beverages produced by native brewers a small brewery if 33 the retailer pays a retail dealer's license fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) 34 to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division.
- 35 (c) Any person not licensed as a wholesale dealer of beer and malt 36 beverages may sell on a wholesale basis beer and malt beverages produced by

1 native brewers a small brewery if the person pays a wholesale dealer's 2 license fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to the division. 3 4 3-5-1407. Transportation. 5 (a) A native small brewery may transport its beer and malt beverages 6 along any highway, road, street, or other thoroughfare of travel. 7 (b)(1) Any native small brewery may ship its products out of the state 8 by common carrier or other appropriate parcel delivery service, and. 9 (2) common Common carriers and other appropriate parcel delivery 10 services may accept beer and malt beverages from Arkansas native small 11 brewers for delivery outside the state. 12 (c)(l) Any native small brewery in this state may ship its products within the state by common carrier or other appropriate parcel delivery 13 14 service, and. 15 (2) common Common carriers and other appropriate parcel delivery 16 services may accept beer and malt beverages from Arkansas native breweries a 17 small brewery for delivery within the state if the beer and malt beverages 18 are only shipped to persons holding a wholesale permit to purchase, store, 19 sell, or dispense beer and malt beverages. 20 21 3-5-1408. Fees and taxes. 22 A native small brewer shall: 23 (1) Pay any applicable city or county license or permit fees and 24 barrelage or taxes and shall pay a state licensing fee to the Alcoholic 25 Beverage Control Division of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) per fiscal year 26 to: 27 (A) Manufacture and sell its beer and malt beverages for 28 consumption, both on and off the premises; and 29 (B) Sell any other beer and malt beverages purchased from 30 a licensed dealer for consumption on or off the premises; 31 (2) Measure beer and malt beverages manufactured by the native 32 small brewer or purchased from a producer brewery, or otherwise comply with 33 applicable regulations respecting excise and enforcement tax determination of 34 the beer and malt beverages, and pay any applicable bond or deposit and the amount of the state excise tax and enforcement tax to this state as required, 35

but is free from the fees and taxes provided in § 3-5-205 and as required by

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1 §§ 3-7-104 and 3-7-111; and 2 (3) Pay a tax at the rate of seven dollars and fifty cents 3 (\$7.50) per barrel, and proportionately for larger and smaller gallonages per 4 barrel, on all beer and malt beverages in quantities of up to sixty thousand 5 sixty thousand (60,000) barrels per year and sold or offered for sale in the 6 state. 7 8 3-5-1409. Beer and malt beverage education. 9 (a)(1) Native brewers A small brewery may be allowed to conduct beer 10 and malt beverage tasting events for educational or promotional purposes at 11 any location in this state if approved by the Alcoholic Beverage Control 12 Division and if written notice is given by the division to the native brewers small brewery at least five (5) days before the event. 13 14 (2) Requests for approval to conduct beer and malt beverage 15 tasting events must shall be received by the division at least two (2) weeks 16 before the event. 17 (b) Beer and malt beverage tasting events may be held in any facility licensed by the division if written notice is given by the division under 18 19 subsection (a) of this section. (c) The criminal penalties for drinking in public as prescribed by § 20 21 5-71-212 are not applicable to any beer and malt beverage tasting event 22 approved by the division under this section. 2.3 24 3-5-1410. Licenses - Application. 25 No native brewers license shall A license as a small brewer shall not 26 be issued unless the applicant files with the Director of the Alcoholic 27 Beverage Control Division a verified application in a form and content that 28 the director requires, accompanied by payment of the applicable fee. 29 30 3-5-1411. Operation without license prohibited. 31 It is a Class C misdemeanor for any person not holding a valid native 32 small brewers license to operate as a native small brewer. 33 34 3-5-1412. Dry areas prohibited. 35 It is unlawful for the Director of the Alcoholic Beverage Control

Division to issue a native brewers license as a small brewer in any city,
