4	(a)(1) Whenever a vacancy shall occur, for any reason, in the office	
5	of alderman in any city of the first class, at any regular meeting after the	
6	occurrence of the vacancy, the city council shall proceed to elect by a	
7	majority vote of the remaining members elected to the council an alderman to	
8	serve for the unexpired term. Provided, however, it is necessary that at	
9	least a quorum of the whole number of the city council shall remain in order	
10	to fill a vacancy.	
11	(2)(b) The person elected by the council shall be a resident of the	
12	ward where the vacancy occurs at the time of the vacancy.	
13	(b) When a vacancy occurs in any position of alderman in a city having	
14	a population of fifty thousand (50,000) or more, according to the most recent	
15	federal decennial census, and having a mayor-council form of government in	
16	which the electors of each ward elect one (1) or more aldermen, a new	
17	alderman shall be chosen in the following manner:
