Collision or accident. 2 (a) It shall be the duty of the operator of a vessel involved in a collision, accident, or other casualty, so far as he or she can do so without 3 4 serious danger to his or her own vessel, crew, and passengers, if any, to 5 render to other persons affected by the collision, accident, or other 6 casualty assistance that may be practicable and that may be necessary in 7 order to save them from or minimize any danger caused by the collision, 8 accident, or other casualty and also to give his or her name, address, and 9 identification of his or her vessel in writing to any person injured and to 10 the owner of any property damaged in the collision, accident, or other 11 casualty. (b) In the case of collision, accident, or other casualty involving a 12 13 vessel, if the collision, accident, or other casualty results in death or 14 injury to a person or damage to property in excess of five hundred dollars 15 (\$500) or the disappearance of a person from a vessel under circumstances 16 that indicate death or injury, the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission or 17 local sheriff's department having an established water patrol shall be immediately notified in order for an investigation to be conducted. In 18 19 addition, the operator of the vessel shall submit a Department of 20 Transportation, United States Coast Guard Form CG-3865 to the Arkansas State 21 Game and Fish Commission Boating Safety Office within ten (10) working days. 22 (c) When a person operating a vessel is involved in a collision, 23 accident, or other casualty resulting in loss of human life or when there is reason to believe death may result, or a law enforcement officer has 24 25 reasonable cause to believe that the person, while operating a vessel, is 26 intoxicated or under the influence of any narcotic drug, barbituate, or 27 marijuana or while under any physical or mental disability so as to be 28 incapable of operating the vessel safely under the prevailing circumstances, a law enforcement officer shall request and the person shall submit to a 29 30 chemical test of the person's blood, breath, or urine in accordance with the provisions of § 5-76-104, even if the person is fatally injured, for the 31 32 purpose of determining the alcohol or controlled substance content of his or 33 her blood, breath, or urine. 34 (e)(d) In accordance with any request duly made by an authorized
