It is found and determined by the General 18 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 19 20 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 21 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of 22 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, with the 23 exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from 24 and after the date of its passage and approval; and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act 25 26 beyond July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be 27 in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval, 28 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of 29 essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared 30 to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and 31 32 after July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be 33 in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

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
