16 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS
17 FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR
18 THE 2009-2010 FISCAL YEAR.
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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2009-2010 fiscal
26 year, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall
27 be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation
28 Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws
29 amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific
30 maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the
31 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons
32 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions
33 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-
34 101), or its successor.

20 CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is
21 hereby authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend
22 provisions of Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of
23 Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid
24 from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction
25 of reporting, as provided by Section 1 of Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
27 ~~2007~~ 2009 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2010.

29 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
31 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher
32 Education shall establish and maintain for the ~~2007-2009~~ 2009-2010 ~~biennium~~
33 fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary
34 level not to exceed ~~\$118,936~~ \$285,000 ~~per year~~. These positions are to be
35 used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the
36 personal services needs of the University during the ~~2007-2009~~ 2009-2010

1 ~~biennium-fiscal year~~ exceed the number of positions allocated to the
 2 University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to
 3 the Arkansas Department of Higher Education for the need to allocate titles
 4 from this "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool
 5 until such time as specific positions are requested by the University,
 6 approved by the University Board or their designee, and approved by the
 7 Legislative Council. Furthermore, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM)
 8 of the Division of Management Services of the Department of Finance and
 9 Administration shall establish and maintain for the ~~2007-2009~~ 2009-2010
 10 ~~biennium-fiscal year~~ a pool of three hundred (300) ~~classified positions at up~~
 11 ~~to a grade 26~~ career service positions up to a C130. These positions are to
 12 be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that
 13 the personal services needs of the University during the ~~2007-2009~~ 2009-2010
 14 ~~biennium-fiscal year~~ exceed the number of positions in a classification
 15 allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide
 16 justification to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool".
 17 No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
 18 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved
 19 by the Legislative Council.

20 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
 21 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
 22 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
 23 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
 24 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
 25 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
 26 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
 27 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
 28 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
 29 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
 30 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
 31 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of
 32 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.
 33 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled
 34 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
 35 void.

36 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as

1 established herein during the next ~~biennium~~-fiscal year, the position(s) must
2 be requested as a new position(s) in the agency's ~~biennial~~-budget request.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

6 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHILD AND
8 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be
9 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas
10 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract
11 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics
12 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family
13 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of
14 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and
15 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically
16 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health
17 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not
18 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and
19 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas
20 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-
21 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas
22 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services
23 offered through CHFLI.

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, ~~2007~~

5 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

7 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship
8 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and
9 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing
10 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such
11 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for

21 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
23 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
24 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
25 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
26 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
27 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
28 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
29 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
30 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
31 President or Chancellor, will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or
32 upon release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief

3 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PURCHASE,
5 LEASE, RENT OR ENCUMBER RAY WINDER FIELD. In no event shall the land and
6 facilities at Ray Winder Field in Little Rock, Arkansas be purchased, leased,
7 rented or encumbered by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
8 without the prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
9 Joint Budget Committee.

10 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
11 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
12 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
13 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
14 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
15 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
16 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences may
17 operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the University of
18 Arkansas for Medical Sciences authorizing broad powers under this Section.
19 Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly
20 maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or
21 Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of
22 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a
23 severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the
24 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a
25 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

26 The provisions of this section shall become effective immediately and
27 shall be in full force and effect upon the date of its passage and approval.
28 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
29 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
30 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
31 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
32 the veto.

34 SECTION 36. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
35 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
36 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the

1 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
2 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
3 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
4 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
5 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
6 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied

9 SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
10 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
11 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
12 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
13 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
14 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
15 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
16 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

17
18 SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
19 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
20 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
21 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of
22 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, with the
23 exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from
24 and after the date of its passage and approval; and that in the event of an
25 extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act
26 beyond July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be
27 in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval,
28 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of
29 essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared
30 to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
31 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
32 after July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be
33 in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
