The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is 18 19 hereby authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend provisions of Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of 20 21 Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid 22 from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction 23 of reporting, as provided by Section 1 of Arkansas Code 19-4-1609. 24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 25 2007 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010. 26 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 28 29 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher 30 Education shall establish and maintain for the 2007-2009 2009-2010 biennium fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary 31 level not to exceed \$118,936 \$285,000 per year. These positions are to be 32 33 used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the 34 personal services needs of the University during the 2007-2009 2009-2010 35 biennium-fiscal year exceed the number of positions allocated to the

University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to

- 1 the Arkansas Department of Higher Education for the need to allocate titles
- 2 from this "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool
- 3 until such time as specific positions are requested by the University,
- 4 approved by the University Board or their designee, and approved by the
- 5 Legislative Council. Furthermore, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM)
- 6 of the Division of Management Services of the Department of Finance and
- 7 Administration shall establish and maintain for the 2007-2009 2009-2010
- 8 biennium fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) classified positions at up
- 9 to a grade 26 career service positions up to a C130. These positions are to
- 10 be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that
- 11 the personal services needs of the University during the 2007-2009 2009-2010
- 12 biennium fiscal year exceed the number of positions in a classification
- 13 allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide
- 14 justification to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool".
- 15 No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
- 16 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved
- 17 by the Legislative Council.
- 18 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
- 19 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
- 20 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
- 21 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
- 22 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
- 23 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
- 24 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
- 25 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
- 26 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
- 27 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
- 28 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
- 29 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of
- 30 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.
- 31 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled
- 32 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
- 33 void.
- 34 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as
- 35 established herein during the next biennium fiscal year, the position(s) must
- 36 be requested as a new position(s) in the agency's biennial budget request.

1 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2 2007 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010. 3 4 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHILD AND 6 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be 7 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas 8 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract 9 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics 10 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family 11 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of 12 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically 13 14 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health 15 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not 16 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and 17 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-18 19 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services 20 21 offered through CHFLI. 22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, 2007 23 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010. 24 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Annotated 19-4-906(a), Item 25 26 No. (119) (137), concerning Motor vehicle restrictions and authorizations, is 27 amended as follows: 28 (119) (137) Univ. of Ark. for Medical Sciences 94 99 29 30 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING 31 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences 32 33 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue, 34 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking 35 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

1 2007 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010.

- 3 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
- 5 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship
- 6 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and
- 7 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing
- 8 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such
- 9 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for

- 19 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
- 21 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
- 22 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
- 23 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
- 24 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
- 25 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
- 26 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during

1 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PURCHASE, LEASE, RENT OR ENCUMBER RAY WINDER FIELD. In no event shall the land and 3 facilities at Ray Winder Field in Little Rock, Arkansas be purchased, leased, 4 5 rented or encumbered by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences 6 without the prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 7 Joint Budget Committee. 8 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 9 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 10 11 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 12 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 13 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences may 14 15 operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the University of 16 Arkansas for Medical Sciences authorizing broad powers under this Section. 17 Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or 18 Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of 19 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a 20 severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the 21 22 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a 23 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void. 24 The provisions of this section shall become effective immediately and 25 shall be in full force and effect upon the date of its passage and approval. 26 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become 27 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor 28 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 29 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides 30 the veto. 31 SECTION 36. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 32 33 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 34 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 35 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and

Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

1	Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
2	Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
3	State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
4	Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
5	with in disbursement of said funds.

7	SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
8	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
9	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
10	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
11	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
12	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
13	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
14	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
15	
16	SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
17	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
18	appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
19	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of
20	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, with the
21	exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from
22	and after the date of its passage and approval; and that in the event of an
23	extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act
24	beyond July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be
25	in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval,
26	could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of
27	essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared
28	to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
29	public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
30	after July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be
31	in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
