22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2009-2010 fiscal
26 year, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall
27 be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation
28 Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws
29 amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific
30 maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the
31 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons
32 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions
33 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-
34 101), or its successor.

5 Medical Sciences will be eligible to receive incentive pay not to exceed 1.2
6 times their base hourly rate. Employees required to be available for duty on
7 nights, weekends and holidays will be eligible to receive standby pay
8 equivalent of up to four hours of work per shift. Employees required to work
9 in specialty areas will be eligible to receive up to ten (10) percent of the

20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
21 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
22 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
23 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
24 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December

3 LEASE, RENT OR ENCUMBER RAY WINDER FIELD. In no event shall the land and

20 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, with the
21 exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from
22 and after the date of its passage and approval; and that in the event of an
23 extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act
24 beyond July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be
25 in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval,
26 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of
27 essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared
28 to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
29 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
30 after July 1, 2009, with the exception that Section 35 in this Act shall be
31 in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
