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## Subtitle

17 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS  
18 FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR  
19 THE 2009-2010 FISCAL YEAR.

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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for  
25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2009-2010 fiscal  
26 year, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall  
27 be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation  
28 Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws  
29 amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific  
30 maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the  
31 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons  
32 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions  
33 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-  
34 101), or its successor.

 17 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2009-2010 fiscal year,  
 18 the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known  
 19 as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes:  
 20 six hundred twenty five (625) temporary or part-time employees, when needed,  
 21 at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification  
 22 and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate  
 23 classification.

25 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE  
 26 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA HELP -  
 27 NATIONAL CENTER FOR TOXICOLOGICAL RESEARCH. There is hereby authorized, for  
 28 the University of Arkansas Medical Sciences - National Center for  
 29 Toxicological Research for the ~~2007-2009~~ 2009-2010 ~~biennium~~ fiscal year, the  
 30 following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as  
 31 "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes:  
 32 fifty-six (56), when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed the rate of pay
