24	in early Spring and sell continuously throughout the Spring, Summer, and		
25	Fall; that in order for the farmers to reap the benefit of their labors		
26	during this growing and harvesting season this act must be enacted with all		
27	due haste. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being		
28	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and		
29	safety shall become effective on:		
30	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
31	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
32	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
33	bill; or		
34	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
35	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
