 - (e)(1) Except as provided in subsection (a) of this section, it is unlawful to perform body art on a person under eighteen (18) years of age, and any person violating this prohibition shall be who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to or is found guilty of a violation of this subdivision is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor.
 - (2) Any person who falsely claims to be the minor's parent or legal guardian for the purpose of obtaining body art for a person under eighteen (18) years of age shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
 - (3) It is not a defense to a criminal prosecution under this section that at the time of the offense, the person who received the body art possessed a letter of consent from the person's parent or legal guardian if the letter was forged or if a person falsely assumed the identity of the minor's parent or legal guardian.
 - (f)(l) It is unlawful to perform body art on any person under eighteen (18) years of age in any unlicensed facility.
- 27 (2) A person who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to or is found 28 guilty of a violation of subdivision (f)(1) of this section is guilty of a 29 Class D felony.
