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14	10-3-2503. Arkansas Legislative Task Force on Autism — Duties.			
15	(a) The Arkansas Legislative Task Force on Autism shall:			
16	(1) Examine how the State of Arkansas responds to autism and			
17	autism spectrum disorders;			
18	(2) Determine the best practices to treat autism and autism			
19	spectrum disorders;			
20	(3) Recommend more efficient methods for treating autism and			
21	autism spectrum disorders;			
22	(4) Recommend how to obtain more federal funds for treating			
23	autism and autism spectrum disorders and provide special education to			
24	children with autism and autism spectrum disorders; and			
25	(5) Recommend to the General Assembly specific changes to the			
26	law that will improve treatment of autism and autism spectrum disorders and			
27	improve the provision of special education to children with autism and autism			
28	spectrum disorders.			
29	(b) On or before August 31 of each year, the task force shall provide			
30	the General Assembly with a written explanation of the recommended			
31	legislative changes.			
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
