It is found and determined by the 30 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there are school districts in 31 economically depressed and low property-wealth areas of the state that face difficulties competing with surrounding, geographically close school 32 33 districts with regard to teacher salaries and that this makes it difficult for districts in such economically depressed and low property-wealth areas to 34

recruit and retain qualified teachers; that this act will provide assistance

to those high-priority districts to assist them in recruiting and retaining

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1	such teachers; and that this act is immediately necessary to provide that
2	assistance for the 2009-2010 school year. Therefore, an emergency is
3	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
4	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
5	on July 1, 2009.
