14	RECOGNIZING THE URGENT NEED FOR HEALTH
15	CARE FOR AMERICA NOW.

18	WHEREAS, families, large and small businesses, health care providers
19 20	and state and local government in Arkansas are struggling to access the
20	quality, affordable healthcare that they need to promote healthy families and a healthy economy in their state and nationally; and
21	a nearthy economy in their state and nationally, and
22	WHEREAS, as a result of the national health care crisis, health
24	insurance premiums in Arkansas increased by sixty-five and eight-tenths
25	percent (65.8%) between 2000 and 2007, while median earnings increased by
26	only eleven and six-tenths percent (11.6%); and
27	
28	WHEREAS, even while the economy is failing, families are still facing
29	skyrocketing annual health care costs that have increased for an average
30	family in Arkansas from six thousand three hundred fifty-five dollars
31	(\$6,355) to ten thousand five hundred thirty-four dollars (\$10,534) between
32	2000 and 2007; and

34	WHEREAS, Arkansas employers also face an increasing cost burden for
35	health insurance premiums as the employer's portion of annual premiums
36	increased from four thousand five hundred eighty-two dollars (\$4,582) to



1 seven thousand one hundred forty-five dollars (\$7,145) between 2000 and 2007; 2 and 3 4 WHEREAS, over four hundred eight-three thousand four hundred sixty-five 5 (483,465) people, including over sixty-two thousand six hundred fifty 6 (62,650) children in Arkansas actually lack any health care coverage at all, 7 making it impossible for these individuals to get access to basic 8 preventative care that could reduce health care costs and health care 9 problems in the long run, 10 11 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING 12 13 THEREIN: 14 15 That the time for a national solution to the American health care 16 crisis that threatens the economic and physical health of the people of 17 Arkansas and people across the country is now. 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Arkansas recognizes the urgent need for a 20 national solution to the health care crisis that meets key criteria for 21 comprehensive health care reform set forth by President Obama and Health Care 22 for America Now including the following: 23 24 Affordable coverage and care, with premiums and out-of-pocket costs 25 based on a family's ability to pay and a choice of providers that meet our 26 families' needs from preventative care to care for serious illness; 27 28 A choice of health insurance plans, including without limitation the 29 right to keep one's current insurance, choose another private plan, or to 30 join a public health insurance plan; 31 32 Equity in health care access, treatment, research, and resources to 33 people and communities of color and strengthening health services in lowincome communities: 34 35 36 A system in which government sets and enforces rules on insurance

company practices and charges, requiring them to put our health care before
 their profits; and

Coverage that is predictable and affordable for working families,
retirees, small businesses, and other employers and that controls costs while
improving quality, with measures such as: lowering administrative expenses,
investing in preventive care, actively managing disease, setting standards
for performance, reducing medical errors, and using the public's purchasing
power to lower drug and other prices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in 2009, local governments, families, providers, and businesses across Arkansas will work together with the newly elected President Obama, the Arkansas congressional delegation, and the leaders of the United States Congress to guarantee quality, affordable health care for everyone in our state and across the country.
