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28	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
29	STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL
30	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:
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32	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
33	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state
34	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives
35	and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election
36	adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of

1 the State of Arkansas, to wit: 2 Section 5 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 3 4 amended to read as follows: 5 § 5. Regular and fiscal sessions Time of meeting. 6 The General Assembly shall meet at the seat of government every 7 year two (2) years, on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in November. 8 (b) The General Assembly shall meet in regular session on the second 9 Monday in January of each odd-numbered year to consider any bill or 10 resolution. The General Assembly may alter the time at which the regular 11 session begins. 12 (c)(1) Beginning in 2010, the General Assembly shall meet in fiscal 13 session on the second Monday in February of each even-numbered year to consider only appropriation bills. The General Assembly may alter the time 14 15 at which the fiscal session begins. 16 (2) A bill other than an appropriation bill may be considered in 17 a fiscal session if two-thirds (2/3) of the members of each house of the General Assembly approve consideration of the bill. 18 19 (d) The General Assembly, by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly, may alter the dates of the 20 21 regular session and fiscal session so that regular sessions occur in even-22 numbered years and the fiscal sessions occur in odd-numbered years. 23 24 SECTION 2. Section 17 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 25 amended to read as follows: 26 § 17. Duration of sessions. 27 (a) A regular biennial session shall not exceed sixty (60) calendar 28 days in duration, unless extended by a vote of two thirds (2/3) of the 29 members elected to each house of the General Assembly. The regular biennial 30 session shall not exceed seventy five (75) calendar days in duration, unless 31 extended by a vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the members elected to each 32 house of the General Assembly. 33 (b) A fiscal session shall not exceed thirty (30) calendar days in

duration, except that by a vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the members elected

to each house of the General Assembly a fiscal session may be extended one

(1) time by no more than fifteen (15) calendar days. The regular biennial

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1 sessions shall not exceed sixty (60) days in duration unless by a vote of 2 two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to each house of the General 3 Assembly. 4 (e) (b) Provided, that this section shall not apply to the first 5 session of the General Assembly under this Constitution, or when impeachments 6 are pending. 7 8 SECTION 3. Section 29 of Article 5 of the Constitution of Arkansas is 9 amended to read as follows: 10 § 29. Appropriations. 11 No money shall be drawn from the treasury except in pursuance of 12 specific appropriation made by law, the purpose of which shall be distinctly stated in the bill, and the maximum amount which may be drawn shall be 13 14 specified in dollars and cents; and no appropriations made by the General 15 Assembly after December 31, 2008, shall be for a longer period period longer 16 than one (1) fiscal year two (2) years. 17 18 SECTION 4. Section 34 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 19 amended to read as follows: 20 § 34. Introduction of bills - Time limit. 21 No new bill shall be introduced into either house during the last three 22 days of a regular or fiscal session. 2.3 24 SECTION 5. Section 39 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 25 amended to read as follows: 26 § 39. State expenses - Limitation - Exceptions. 27 § 3. Excepting monies raised or collected for educational purposes, 28 highway purposes, to pay Confederate pensions and the just debts of the 29 State, the General Assembly is hereby prohibited from appropriating or 30 expending more than the sum of Two and One-Half Million Dollars two million 31 five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) for all purposes, for any fiscal 32 year biennial period; provided the limit herein fixed may be exceeded by the 33 votes of three-fourths (3/4) of the members elected to each House of the 34 General Assembly. 35

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SECTION 6. Section 40 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is

1	amended to read as follows:
2	§ 40. General appropriation bill - Enactment.
3	§ 4. In making appropriations for any fiscal year biennial period, the
4	General Assembly shall first pass the General Appropriation Bill provided for
5	in Section 30 of Article 5 of the Constitution, and no other appropriation
6	bill may be enacted before that shall have been is done.
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8	SECTION 7. Section 7 of Amendment 35 to the Arkansas Constitution,
9	concerning the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission, is amended to read as
10	follows:
11	7. Executive Secretary and other personnel - Selection - Salaries and
12	expenditures.
13	The Commission shall elect an Executive Secretary, whose salary shall
14	not exceed that of limitations placed on other constitutional departments;
15	and other executive officers, supervisor, personnel, office assistants,
16	wardens, game refuge keepers, and hatchery employees, whose salaries and
17	expenditures must be submitted to the Legislature and approved by an Act
18	covering specific items in the $\underline{\text{biennial}}$ appropriation as covered by Article
19	$\frac{\text{XVI}}{16}$ Section 4 of the Constitution.
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21	SECTION 8. This amendment shall not construed to alter the Governor's
22	authority to call a special session of the General Assembly.
