16 AN ACT FOR THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY
17 APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2010-2011 FISCAL
18 YEAR.
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the State
24 Board of Pharmacy for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, the following maximum number
25 of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of
26 the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et
27 seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,
28 that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein
29 in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
30 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
31 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
32 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
33 successor.

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12 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the State Board of
 13 Pharmacy for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, the following maximum number of part-
 14 time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds
 15 appropriated herein for such purposes: four (4) temporary or part-time
 16 employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the
 17 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act
 18 for the appropriate classification.

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20 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - CASH OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 21 to the State Board of Pharmacy, to be payable from the cash fund deposited in
 22 the State Treasury as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State,
 23 for personal services and operating expenses of the State Board of Pharmacy
 24 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the following:

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 5 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - PHARMACY STUDENT LOANS. There is hereby
 6 appropriated, to the State Board of Pharmacy, to be payable from the cash
 7 funds in the State Treasury as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
 8 State, for transfer by warrant to the cash fund as defined by Arkansas Code
 9 19-4-801 of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences - College of
 10 Pharmacy, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the following:

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 16 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
 18 BY WARRANT. ~~Immediately upon the effective date of this Act, the Chief Fiscal~~
 19 ~~Officer of the State shall cause a transfer by warrant the sum of five~~
 20 ~~hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) from the balance of cash funds deposited~~
 21 ~~in the State Treasury for the State Board of Pharmacy, to the cash fund as~~
 22 ~~defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the University of Arkansas for Medical~~
 23 ~~Sciences, there to be used for the sole purpose of providing funding for the~~
 24 ~~CASH FUND— PHARMACY STUDENT LOANS appropriation that provides loans to~~
 25 ~~pharmacy students by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences—~~
 26 ~~College of Pharmacy.~~ If, during the ~~2009-2010~~ 2010-2011 fiscal year, the need
 27 arises for additional funding for student loans and additional funds become
 28 available, the Director of the State Board of Pharmacy may request the Chief
 29 Fiscal Officer of the State to cause a transfer by warrant up to fifty
 30 thousand dollars (\$50,000) from the balance of cash funds deposited in the
 31 State Treasury for the State Board of Pharmacy to the cash fund as defined by
 32 the Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the University of Arkansas for Medical
 33 Sciences, there to be used for the sole purpose of providing student loans to
 34 pharmacy students.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2009~~
 36 2010 through June 30, ~~2010~~ 2011.

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SECTION 6. EMPLOYMENT OF ATTORNEYS. None of the funds appropriated in this Act for Maintenance and General Operation shall be expended in payment for services of attorneys, unless the agency shall first make a request in writing to the Attorney General of the State of Arkansas to provide the required legal services. The Attorney General's Office shall provide the requested legal services, or, if the Attorney General's Office shall determine that sufficient personnel are not available to provide the requested legal services, the Attorney General shall certify the same to the agency and may authorize the agency to employ legal counsel and to expend monies appropriated for Maintenance and General Operations therefor, if:

- (1) The Attorney General determines, and certifies in writing, that such agency needs the advice or assistance of legal counsel, and
- (2) The Attorney General consents in writing to the employment of the legal counsel to be retained by the agency.

Such certification shall be required with respect to each instance of the employment of special legal counsel, or shall be required annually with respect to legal counsel employed on a retainer basis. A copy of such certification shall be entered in the official minutes of the agency, and shall be retained in the fiscal records of the agency for audit purposes.

SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

1 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
2 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
3 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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5 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
6 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
7 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
8 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2010 is essential to the operation of
9 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
10 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
11 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2010 could work irreparable harm
12 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
13 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
14 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
15 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2010.

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
