6	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the				
7	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas Code § 21-6-412 has				
8	resulted in inequitable compensation for certain elected officials and that				
9	this act should become effective as soon as possible to stop these				
10	inequitable payments. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this				
11	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,				
12	health, and safety shall become effective on:				
13	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;				
14	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,				
15	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the				
16	<u>bill; or</u>				
17	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
