EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 25 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that employees convicted of theft 26 of property against the employer are currently eligible to draw retirement 27 benefits from the employer; that these members should not be allowed to profit from their crimes; and that for the months in which the thefts 28 29 occurred, the portion of those benefits that are from employer contributions 30 should not be paid to the members. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, 31 32 health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2011. 33 34 35

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
