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1	(3) A member who has retired and commenced receiving benefits in
2	any month between January 2009 and June 2009, inclusive, shall have the one-
3	hundred-eighty-day separation requirement waived and may return to employment
4	otherwise covered by the system no sooner than thirty (30) calendar days from
5	the commencement of his or her retirement.
6	(c)(l) An elected public official may retire and begin receiving
7	retirement benefits if the elected public official is a member:
8	(A) Whose current service in public office in one (1) form
9	of government is covered by § 24-4-521(b)(5); and
10	(B) Who is elected to public office in a different form of
11	government and will begin serving in that public office immediately after the
12	expiration of his or her term of public office described in subdivision

14	(2) The member shall notify the retirement system of his or her
15	impending service in another form of government at least thirty (30) days
16	prior to the first day of the month in which that service will begin. A
17	completed retirement application shall be submitted at that time.
18	(3) As used in this subsection, "form of government" means city
19	government, county government, or state government.
20	(d) Persons failing to meet termination requirements shall forfeit
21	their benefits until requirements are met to the system all of the retirement
22	benefits he or she has received notwithstanding any other provision of the
23	Arkansas Code and shall forfeit receipt of his or her monthly benefit payment
24	until termination requirements are met.
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26	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
27	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that members of the Arkansas Public
28	Employees' Retirement System have been rehired by covered employers after
29	having only been retired a nominal period of time; that these employees are
30	receiving both retirement and wages from the state; that the rehiring of
31	retired employees is preventing other Arkansans from acquiring employment
32	with the state; that the rehiring of retired employees is preventing current
33	state employees from receiving promotions; and that this act is immediately
34	necessary, because without immediate effectiveness, a significant number of
35	current retirement system members might avail themselves of the opportunity
36	to retire before the more restrictive provisions apply resulting in a

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1	substantial, detrimental impact on the retirement system. Therefore, an
2	emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the
3	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
4	<u>on July 1, 2011.</u>
