19	(c) $(1)$ Appointments shall be for a term of five (5) years or, in the		
20	event of vacancies, for the period of the unexpired term of the vacancy being		
21	filled.		
22	(2) The chair of the Arkansas Division, Ouachita Society of		
23	American Foresters, duly authorized and acting on behalf of the Arkansas		
24	division, shall make nominations described in subdivision (b)(2) of this		
25	section within thirty (30) days from the receipt of notice from any person of		
26	the occurrence of a vacancy on the board.		
27	(d) Each member of the board shall receive a certificate of		
28	appointment from the Governor and before beginning the term of office shall		
29	file with the Secretary of State a written oath or affirmation relative to

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34	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-31-302 is amended to read as follows:		
35	17-31-302. Qualifications.		
36	Effective January 1, 2001. The applicant must pass a written examination on		

- l basic forestry subjects administered by the Arkansas State Board of
- 2 Registration for Foresters with a score established by the board along with
- 3 the following shall be considered as minimum evidence satisfactory to the
- 4 Arkansas State Board of Registration for Foresters that an applicant is
- 5 qualified to be registered as a forester:
- 6 (1) A bachelor's or advanced degree in forestry from a college 7 or university program accredited by the Society of American Foresters. The
- 8 written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board
- 9 shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%);
- 10 (2) A bachelor's or advanced degree in forestry from a college
- 11 or university program not accredited by the Society of American Foresters
- 12 and, subject to graduation, three (3) years or more experience in forestry
- 13 work of a nature satisfactory to the board. The written examination on basic
- 14 forestry subjects administered by the board shall be passed with a score of
- 15 at least seventy percent (70%);
- 16 (3) A bachelor's degree in a natural resources-related field
- 17 from a college or university program, including, but not limited to, wildlife
- 18 management, with at least twenty (20) semester hours of forestry courses
- 19 approved by the board and, subsequent to graduation, three (3) years' or more
- 20 experience in forestry work of a nature satisfactory to the board. The
- 21 written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board
- 22 shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%);
- 23 (4) A bachelor's degree not related to natural resources from a
- 24 college or university program and, subsequent to graduation, six (6) years'
- 25 or more experience in forestry work of a nature satisfactory to the board.
- 26 The written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board
- 27 shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%); and; or
- 28 (5) A two-year associate's degree in forestry from a community
- 29 college or junior college and, subsequent to graduation, six (6) years' or
- 30 more of experience in forestry work of a nature satisfactory to the board.
- 31 The written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board
- 32 shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%).
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- 34 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-31-303 is amended to read as follows:
- 35 17-31-303. Application for registration.
- 36 (a) Application for registration shall:

- 1 (1) Be on forms prescribed and furnished by the Arkansas State 2 Board of Registration for Foresters;
- 3 (2) Contain statements under oath giving a detailed summary of 4 the applicant's education and technical experience; and
- (3) Contain the names and addresses of not fewer than five (5) references, of whom three (3) or more shall be <u>registered</u> foresters who have personal or professional knowledge of the applicant's forestry experience or his or her character and ability. Not more than one (1) such reference may come from persons employed by the same firm or individual as that of the applicant, and not more than one (1) reference may come from personnel of the school or college attended by the applicant.
  - (b) The amount of the application fee and the registration fee shall be set annually by the board.
- 14 (c) No  $\underline{A}$  person shall  $\underline{not}$  be eligible for registration as a forester who is not of good character and reputation.

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- SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-31-307 is amended to read as follows:
- 18 17-31-307. Expiration and renewal.
- 19 (a) Certificates of registration shall expire on December 31 of the 20 year for which issued or renewed and shall become invalid thereafter unless 21 renewed.
  - (b) The Secretary of the Arkansas State Board of Registration for Foresters shall notify by letter to the last known address every person registered under this chapter of the date of the expiration of the certificate and the amount of the fee required for its renewal of one (1) year. Notice shall be mailed delivered at least one (1) month in advance of the date of the expiration of such a certificate.
  - (c)(1) The board shall require persons who are licensed under this subchapter to complete not fewer than six (6) hours of continuing forestry education during the previous year beginning January 1, 2001, as a condition of license renewal. Continuing forestry education shall be equivalent to the Society of American Foresters Category I for continuing forestry education which includes, but is not limited to, seminars, short courses, and workshops in forestry or a related subject matter as approved by the board.
- 35 (2) Credit accrues at a rate of one (1) hour for each hour of actual contact. Three (3) hours of tours or field sessions equal one (1)

## 1 contact hour.

- 2 (3) The board may approve continuing forestry education courses 3 offered by professional organizations, institutions of higher learning, 4 qualified individuals, or specialty societies. The board may approve credit 5 hours for meetings, presentations, or other activities considered by the 6 board to be a form of continuing forestry education.
- 7 (4) A successful applicant for licensure under this subchapter 8 shall have two (2) years from the date the license is issued to complete the 9 first six (6) hours of year's requirements for continuing forestry education. 10 After two (2) years, the registered forester shall complete the continuing 11 forestry education requirements as required by this subsection.
  - (d) The board may waive the continuing forestry education requirements in cases of hardship, illness, or retirement from active forestry practice.
  - (e) The board may promulgate rules and regulations to ensure compliance with the requirements of this section.
- 16 (f) Renewal of a certificate of registration shall be for  $\frac{an \ annual}{a}$  17 fee set annually by the board.
  - (g) The failure on the part of any registrant to renew the certificate annually in the month of December as required in this section shall not deprive the person of the right of renewal, but the fee to be paid for the renewal of a certificate after December 31 shall be increased ten percent (10%) for each month or fraction of a month that payment of renewal is delayed. However, the maximum fee for delayed renewal shall not exceed two (2) times the annual renewal fee.

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
