SECTION 86. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 13 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 14 15 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011, with the exception that Section 80 16 17 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its 18 passage and approval, is essential to the operation of the agency for which 19 the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an 20 extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011, with the exception that Section 80 in this Act shall 21 22 be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and 23 approval, could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
