In the event the Department determines to enter into a 26 professional contract for mental health services, the Department may, upon 27 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after prior review and 28 approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, make 29 appropriate transfers from regular salaries, personal services matching and 30 various maintenance and operation classifications to the professional fees 31 and services classification for payment of the contractual amount.

COUNTY 19 JAIL INVOICE SUMMARY. The Departments of Correction and Community 20 Correction, shall at a minimum and on a fiscal year basis, prepare and post 21 on the applicable agency web site, a monthly summary of county jail 22 reimbursement invoices prepared and forwarded to each county sheriff for 23 verification by the Departments and for payment from the County Jail 24 Reimbursement Fund. In addition, the report shall include a summary of 25 invoices returned by each county for payment for previous months within the 26 fiscal year, the amounts paid, and any balances owed. Each fiscal year-end 27 report shall be maintained on the web sites for a period of no less than 28 three (3) years.

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SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 3 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATION AND FUNDS TO THE COUNTY JAIL REIMBURSEMENT FUND. If any 5 6 savings of general revenue appropriation and funds accrue during the 2010-7 2011 2011-2012 fiscal year in the operations of the Department of Correction, 8 the Director of the Department of Correction may request a transfer of 9 appropriation and funds from any line item appropriation in the Inmate Care 10 and Custody Fund Account to the County Jail Reimbursement Fund in order to 11 meet obligations to counties for housing state inmates. Such transfer 12 request shall be made upon the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 13 State and prior review and approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or 14 Joint Budget Committee.

15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2010
16 <u>2011</u> through June 30, 2011 <u>2012</u>.

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SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOCAL 20 GOVERNMENT INMATE COST REPORT. Each calendar year, the Association of 21 Arkansas Counties shall compile and submit a report to the Arkansas 22 Legislative Council, of all costs incurred, excluding construction costs, by 23 local government units housing inmates sentenced to the Department of 24 Correction and Department of Community Correction. The cost report shall be 25 a representative sample of all counties housing and caring for state inmates. 26 The report shall be submitted no later than July 1 of the calendar year 27 immediately following the reporting year.

28 The Association of Arkansas Counties in coordination with Legislative 29 Audit shall determine which counties will be included in the sample and shall 30 include a sufficient number of counties from each classification based upon 31 population and each congressional district to ensure a fair representation of 32 costs incurred. Guidelines for preparing this cost report shall be developed 33 by the Division of Legislative Audit in coordination with the Association of 34 Arkansas Counties. The Division of Legislative Audit shall test the accuracy 35 of the information submitted during the routine audit of the applicable 36 county.

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The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2010 2011
 through June 30, 2011 2012.

- 4 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ESSENTIAL 6 <u>SERVICES STIPEND. The Arkansas Department of Correction (ADC) may award</u> 7 <u>additional compensation to those exempt employees who are members of the</u> 8 <u>emergency response unit. These employees are eligible to receive up to 3% per</u> 9 <u>hour additional compensation for the actual number of hours that an employee</u> 10 <u>spends on an emergency response action.</u>
- 11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 12 2011 through June 30, 2012.
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14 SECTION 36. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 15 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 16 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 17 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 18 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 19 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 20 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 21 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 22 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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24 SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 25 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 26 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 27 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 28 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 29 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 30 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 31 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 32

33 <u>SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the</u>
 34 <u>General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits</u>

- 35 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
- 36 <u>effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011 is essential to the operation of</u>

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1	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
2	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
3	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm
4	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
5	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
6	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
7	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011.
