7	other healthcare professional shall annually train volunteer school personnel		
8	designated as care providers in a plan developed under Section 504 of the		
9	Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as it existed on July 1, 2011, to administer		
10	Glucagon to a student with Type I diabetes.		
11	(ii) The parent or guardian of a student with Type I		
12	diabetes shall sign an authorization to allow the administration of Glucagon		
13	to the student by volunteer school personnel designated as care providers.		
14	(iii) The school district shall maintain a copy of		
15	the plan developed under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as it		
16	existed on July 1, 2011, a list of volunteer school personnel who are		
17	designated as care providers and trained to administer Glucagon, and a copy		
18	of the parent's or guardian's signed authorization.		
19	(C) A school district, school district employee, or an agent of

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                       (B)(i) Invasive medical procedures required by students
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     and provided at the school shall be performed by trained, licensed personnel
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1	who are licensed to perform the task subject to § 17-87-102(6)(D) or other
2	professional licensure statutes, unless permitted under § 17-87-103(10) and
3	<u>(11)</u> .
4	(ii) The regular classroom teacher shall not perform
5	these tasks, except that public school employees may volunteer to be trained
6	and administer Glucagon to a student with Type I diabetes in an emergency
7	situation permitted under § 17-87-103(11); and
