18	other governmental bodies by individual colleges and universities, agencies,		
19	boards, or commissions shall be submitted directly to the Department of		
20	Higher Education no later than October 1, 2009 <u>November 1, 2011</u> , and each		
21	year thereafter for inclusion in the Comprehensive Arkansas Higher Education		
22	Annual Report.		
23	(b) If an institution of higher education fails to submit the required		
24	reports to the department by October 15 November 15, the institutions shall		
25	appear before the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on		
26	Education to explain why they failed to meet the submission deadline.		
27	(c) Financial information provided by an institution of higher		
28	education is subject to review by the Division of Legislative Audit, and any		
29	adjustments made to previously submitted financial information during the		
30	course of a financial audit may be revised based upon recommendations made by		
31	the division.

3	6-63-103. Affirmative action programs — Plans — Annual reports.		
4	(a)(1) All Each state-supported colleges and universities institution		
5	of higher education shall prepare an affirmative action program for the		
6	recruitment of blacks African-Americans and other members of minorities for		
7	faculty and staff positions and for enrollment as students.		
8	(2) Affirmative action plans shall be prepared on a continuing		
9	basis for future five-year periods.		
10	(b)(1) Each state-supported college and university institution of		
11	higher education shall annually prepare annually a summary report on the		
12	steps that have been taken to reach the goals of the plan.		
13	(2) The report shall include :		
14	(A) Include information on the progress made by the		
15	institutions each institution for the various levels of employment within the		
16	institution -; and		
17	(B) Be presented in a table format limited to no more than		
18	five (5) pages.		
19	(c) Copies of each institution's the five-year plan and annual reports		
20	summaries of each institution of higher education shall be included in the		
21	Comprehensive Higher Education Annual Report, filed with the Governor, the		
22	Department of Higher Education, the president and board of trustees of the		
23	institution, the board of visitors of the institution, if applicable, and the		
24	<u>interim</u> House <u>interim Committee</u> on Education and the <u>interim</u> Senate		
25	interim Committee on Education.		
26	(d) In carrying out the affirmative action plans, each institution of		
27	higher education shall provide for a part-time or full-time employee to		
28	assist the institution in the recruitment of blacks <u>African-Americans</u> and		
29	other members of minorities for faculty and staff positions and for		
30	enrollment as students.		
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
