36	SECTION 2. E	MERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and	determined by the

1	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Juli's law is intended to		
2	protect Arkansans from heinous crimes; that rape is a heinous crime that can		
3	occur at any time; that the protections under Juli's Law will be enhanced by		
4	the addition of rape as a reportable crime; and because no time should be		
5	lost in providing this protection to the people of Arkansas. Therefore, an		
6	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for		
7	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become		
8	effective on:		
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
11	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
12	bill; or		
13	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
14	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
