27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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29	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-61-218 is amended to read as follows:	
30	6-61-218. Minimum college core — Transferability.	
31	In order to <u>To</u> promote a coordinated system of higher education in	
32	Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the	
33	publicly supported state-supported institutions of higher education, the	
34	Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall establish in consultation	on
35	with the colleges and universities state-supported institutions of higher	
36	education a minimum core of courses which shall apply toward the general	



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1	education core curriculum requirements for associate and baccalaureate
2	degrees at state-supported institutions of higher education and which shall
3	be fully transferable between state <u>all state-supported</u> institutions <u>of</u>
4	higher education.
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6	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-61-225 is repealed.
7	6-61-225. Creation of a statewide comprehensive transfer policy.
8	(a)(1) By December 1, 2006, the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
9	Board shall implement a transfer curriculum for all state public colleges and
10	universities.
11	(2)(A) The transfer curriculum shall be known as the "State
12	Minimum Core Curriculum" and shall incorporate and replace the existing state
13	minimum core as set forth in § 6-61-218.
14	(B) The curriculum shall include freshman-level and
15	sophomore-level general education courses offered at the Arkansas public
16	colleges and universities and shall be accepted for full credit in that
17	subject-matter area of emphasis at all public colleges and universities.
18	(3) Private institutions of higher education in Arkansas may
19	participate in the curriculum.
20	(4) If a course is included in the curriculum, the course shall
21	be accepted for full credit in that area of emphasis at all public colleges
22	and universities in Arkansas.
23	(b) The board, in consultation with the colleges and universities,
24	shall develop the criteria and guidelines for the development of the
25	curriculum.
26	(c)(l) By December 1, 2006, the board shall publish an Internet-based
27	student manual that identifies and describes how general education courses at
28	public institutions of higher education transfer to other public institutions
29	of higher education within Arkansas.
30	(2) General information concerning the curriculum, including the
31	web-page link, shall be published in all versions of course catalogs of all
32	public colleges and universities.
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34	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-61-231 is amended to read as follows:
35	6-61-231. Statewide transfer agreement.
36	(a) As used in this section:

1 (1) "Designated transfer degree" means one (1) of the following 2 associate degrees that is eligible for the full transfer under this section 3 of credits earned and hours completed: 4 (A) Associate of arts; 5 (B) Associate of science; or 6 (C) Associate of arts in teaching; 7 (2) "Lower division Lower-division credits" means freshman and 8 sophomore level course credits; 9 (3) "Public institution of higher education" means an Arkansas 10 state-supported two-year or four-year college or university; and 11 (4)(A) "State minimum core curriculum" means sixty (60) semester 12 hours of lower-division coursework that include the thirty-five-hour general 13 education core, major program prerequisites, and elective requirements that satisfy the requirements of an associate of arts degree, an associate of 14 15 science degree, an associate of arts in teaching degree, and selected baccalaureate degrees at all public institutions of higher education as 16 17 determined by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board. 18 (B) The board, in collaboration with state-supported institutions of higher education, shall select the baccalaureate degree 19 20 programs of study that shall be included in the state minimum core curriculum based on the demand for the program of study, both in terms of the number or 21 22 students enrolled in the program of study and the need for students to enroll 23 in a program of study to meet the economic development needs of the state. 24 (C) The completed state minimum core curriculum may vary 25 for each student depending on his or her program of study; and 26 (5) "Transfer student" means a student transferring from a 27 completed designated transfer degree program or a completed state minimum 28 core curriculum to a baccalaureate program at a four-year public institution 29 of higher education. 30 (b)(1) The purpose of this section is to eliminate obstacles to 31 transfers of credits among public institutions of higher education in 32 Arkansas by providing a seamless transfer of academic credits from a completed designated transfer degree program or a completed state minimum 33 core curriculum to a baccalaureate degree program without the loss of earned 34 35 credits and without the receiving public institution of higher education

36 requiring additional lower division lower-division general education credits.

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1	(2) All public institutions of higher education shall provide
2	comprehensive academic advising to all students regarding transfer options
3	available under this section.
4	(c) By January 1, 2010, the <u>The</u> Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
5	Board board shall develop a statewide transfer agreement that:
6	(1) Designates the following as transfer degrees at public
7	institutions of higher education in Arkansas:
8	(A) Associate of arts;
9	(B) Associate of science; and
10	(C) Associate of arts in teaching;
11	(2) Requires a four-year public institution of higher education
12	to accept all hours completed and credits earned for a designated transfer
13	degree or a completed state minimum core curriculum upon a student's transfer
14	to a baccalaureate degree program at the four-year public institution of
15	higher education;
16	(3) Contains the transfer curriculum for each designated
17	transfer degree that is approved by the board under subsection (d) of this
18	section;
19	(4)(A) Requires a four-year public institution of higher
20	education to admit a transfer student to junior status in a baccalaureate
21	degree program at the four-year public institution of higher education.
22	(B)(i) A four-year public institution of higher education
23	receiving a transfer student shall not require additional lower division
24	lower-division credits for the transfer student if the additional course is
25	considered a general education lower division <u>lower-division</u> course.
26	(ii) The receiving four-year public institution of
27	higher education may only require the additional lower division <u>lower-</u>
28	division course if the additional lower division course is:
29	(a) A prerequisite for courses in the transfer
30	student's baccalaureate degree program;
31	(b) A discipline-specific course that is
32	required by the transfer student's baccalaureate degree program and the
33	student has not completed a course at the two-year public institution of
34	higher education that is comparable to the discipline-specific course at the
35	four-year public institution of higher education in the Arkansas Course
36	Transfer System; or

1 (c) A requirement of an independent licensing 2 or accrediting body. 3 (C) This subsection (c) does not remove the requirement 4 that a transfer student must meet total baccalaureate degree program eredit 5 hour credit-hour and course requirements in order to be eligible for a 6 baccalaureate degree. 7 (D) The receiving four-year public institution of higher 8 education shall determine whether to accept a grade of "D" for academic 9 course credit for a student transferring from a two year public institution 10 of higher education; and 11 (5)(A)(i) Requires a four-year Allows public institutions of 12 higher education to develop transfer guidelines and articulation agreements 13 for each two-year public institution of higher education that has a campus 14 within fifty (50) miles of the four-year public institution of higher 15 education degree programs not otherwise covered under this section. 16 (ii) If a two-year public institution of higher 17 education does not have a campus that is within fifty (50) miles of a four-18 year public institution of higher education, the four-year public institution 19 of higher education that is nearest to the two-year public institution of 20 higher education shall develop the transfer guidelines under this subdivision 21 (c)(5). 22 (B) The guidelines shall outline courses for each four-23 year public institution baccalaureate degree program that will prepare 24 students for entry into that baccalaureate degree program without additional 25 general education credits. 26 (C) Transfer guidelines are only for the purpose of 27 student advising and do not exempt a four-year public institution of higher 28 education from the requirements of subdivision (c)(4) of this section. 29 (d)(1) The board, with the assistance and cooperation of the public 30 institutions of higher education, shall develop: 31 (1) (A) A transfer curriculum for each designated transfer 32 degree; 33 (2)(B) Policies and procedures for reviewing and updating the 34 statewide transfer agreement; and 35 (3)(A)(C)(i) Policies and procedures for the Department of 36 Higher Education to collect data from public institutions of higher education

1 to ensure that: 2 (i) (a) All public institutions of higher education 3 comply with this section; and 4 (ii)(b) The statewide transfer agreement is 5 fostering both a seamless transfer process and the academic success of 6 transfer students at Arkansas public institutions of higher education. 7 (B)(ii) The department shall determine annually the data 8 to be collected and shall establish by rule the procedures for a public 9 institution of higher education to provide the data requested. 10 (2) The board, in collaboration with public institutions of 11 higher education and faculty advisory panels of public institutions of higher 12 education, shall identify: 13 (A) Degree programs offered by public institutions of 14 higher education; 15 (B) Postsecondary career education programs offered by 16 two-year public institutions of higher education, including those designated 17 as college-credit courses applicable toward a certificate or degree; 18 (C) Courses that meet the thirty-five-hour general 19 education core requirements within the subject areas of communication, 20 mathematics, social sciences, humanities, and natural sciences that shall be accepted at all public institutions of higher education as general education 21 22 courses; 23 (D) Lower-division courses offered by four-year public institutions of higher education accepted for credit toward a degree and 24 identify those courses as either general education or required as a 25 prerequisite for a degree; and 26 27 (E)(i) Common prerequisite courses and course substitutions for degree programs across all public institutions of higher 28 29 education. 30 (ii) Required thirty-five-hour general education core courses shall be offered and accepted by all public institutions of 31 32 higher education. 33 (3) All public institutions of higher education shall collaborate to form four-year faculty advisory panels and two-year faculty 34 advisory panels that recommend major program prerequisites, course 35 36 substitutions, and elective requirements for programs of study that shall be

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1	included in the state minimum core curriculum.
2	(e)(1) The board shall publish an Internet-based student manual that
3	identifies the state minimum core curriculum and describes how the state
4	minimum core curriculum transfers to other public institutions of higher
5	education within Arkansas.
6	(2) General information concerning the state minimum core
7	curriculum, including the web-page link, shall be published in all versions
8	of course catalogs of all public institutions of higher education.
9	(f)(1) The state minimum core curriculum shall be fully implemented no
10	later than July 1, 2012.
11	(2) A public institution of higher education that is not in full
12	compliance with this section shall not be eligible to accept state aid from
13	the Higher Education Grants Fund Account on behalf of a student.
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15	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 61, Subchapter 2, is amended
16	to add an additional subsection to read as follows:
17	6-61-232. Maximum semester hours required for a degree program.
18	(a)(l) An associate degree program shall require no more than sixty
19	(60) semester hours of lower division college credit, which may be satisfied
20	by completing the state minimum core curriculum under § 6-61-231.
21	(2) An associate degree program may require more than sixty (60)
22	semester hours of lower division college credit if prior approval has been
23	granted by the board of trustees of the state-supported institution of higher
24	education and the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
25	(b)(1) A baccalaureate degree program shall require no more than one
26	hundred twenty (120) semester hours of college credit, which shall include
27	the state minimum core curriculum under § 6-61-231.
28	(2) A baccalaureate degree program may require more than one
29	hundred twenty (120) semester hours of college credit if:
30	(A) Prior approval has been granted by the board of
31	trustees of the state-supported four-year institution of higher education and
32	the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board; or
33	(B) It is a requirement of an independent licensing or
34	accrediting body.
35	(c) All required coursework shall count toward the associate of arts
36	degree, associate of science degree, associate of arts in teaching degree, or

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1	selected baccalaureate degrees.
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3	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 61, is amended to add an
4	additional subchapter to read as follows:
5	<u>Subchapter 14 — Common Course Numbering System</u>
6	<u>6-61-1401.</u> Purpose.
7	The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in collaboration with
8	all state-supported institutions of higher education, shall implement a
9	statewide common course numbering system that:
10	(1) Provides improved program planning;
11	(2) Increases communication among all delivery systems;
12	(3) Facilitates the transfer of students and credits between
13	state-supported institutions of higher education; and
14	(4) Promotes consistency in course designation and
15	identification.
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17	6-61-1402. Courses included in the common course numbering system.
18	(a)(1) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in
19	collaboration with all state-supported institutions of higher education,
20	shall develop and approve a statewide common course numbering system for
21	lower division general education courses found within the Arkansas Course
22	<u>Transfer System.</u>
23	(2) A state-supported institution of higher education that is
24	not in full compliance with this subchapter shall not be eligible to accept
25	state aid from the Higher Education Grants Fund Account on behalf of a
26	student.
27	(b)(1) A course designated as an upper-division course level may be
28	offered by any four-year state-supported institution of higher education and
29	shall be characterized by a need for advanced academic preparation and skills
30	that a student would be unlikely to achieve without significant prior
31	<u>coursework.</u>
32	(2) Upper-division courses are not required to be included in
33	<u>the common course numbering system.</u>
34	(c) A course designated as a lower-division course level may be
35	offered by any state-supported institution of higher education.
36	(d) The common course numbering system shall include the thirty-five

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1	hour general education core and major program prerequisites that are included
2	in the state minimum core curriculum under § 6-61-231.
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4	6-61-1403. Additions or alterations.
5	(a) The Director of the Department of Higher Education shall recommend
6	to the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board any additions or
7	alterations to the common course numbering system.
8	(b) The board, with input from the President's Council, shall consider
9	the recommended additions and alterations to the common course numbering
10	system.
11	(c) The board may adopt or refuse to adopt suggested additions or
12	alterations to the common course numbering system.
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14	6-61-1404. Course listings.
15	Each state-supported institution of higher education shall include the
16	common course numbers approved by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
17	Board in all:
18	(1) Course listings;
19	(2) Course documents;
20	(3) Catalogs;
21	(4) Websites; and
22	(5) Other published materials that designate course listings.
23	
24	<u>6-61-1405.</u> Participation by institutions of higher education that are
25	not state-supported.
26	An institution of higher education that is not state-supported may
27	participate in the common course numbering system if the institution has
28	approved courses listed in the state minimum core curriculum under § 6-61-
29	<u>231.</u>
30	
31	<u>6-61-1406. Courses review.</u>
32	The Department of Higher Education shall:
33	(1) Regularly schedule reviews of courses that are listed in the
34	<pre>common course numbering system;</pre>
35	(2) Establish review procedures; and
36	(3) Adopt policies to carry out this section.

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2	6-61-1407. Data collection.
3	(a) The Department of Higher Education shall adopt policies for the
4	collection of data to ensure that all institutions of higher education that
5	participate in the common course numbering system comply with this
6	subchapter.
7	(b) The department shall determine the data to be collected and
8	annually notify each participating institution of higher education in a
9	timely manner.
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11	SECTION 6. Not to be codified.
12	(a) Each state-supported institution of higher education shall fully
13	participate in the common course numbering system by July 1, 2013.
14	(b) The Department of Higher Education shall file a report with the
15	General Assembly on the compliance of state-supported institutions of higher
16	education with this subchapter on August 15, 2013.
