20	highway department fu	unds, is amended to read as follows:	
21	27-70-204. Int	terest on state highway department fun	ıds.
22	(a) On the fir	est day of business of the month, the	Treasurer of State
23	shall compute the ave	erage daily balance of the State Highw	ay and
24	Transportation Depart	ment Fund, including all internal acc	counts and funds,
25	including, but not li	imited to, the Special Construction Ac	count, the State
26	Aid Road Fund, the St	tate Aid Street Account <u>Fund</u> , the Stat	e Highway and
27	Transportation Depart	ement Fund, and any other funds admini	stered by the
28	Arkansas State Highwa	ay and Transportation Department durin	g the preceding
29	month and shall trans	sfer on that day to the State Highway	and Transportation
30	Department Fund inter	rest on the average daily balance to b	e computed at a
31	rate equivalent to th	ne average rate of interest earned on	all State Treasury

35		kansas Code Title 27, Chapter 72, Subc	hapter 4 is amended
36	to read as follows:		

1	27-72-401. Definition Definitions.
2	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires,
3	"state aid streets" means those streets or state highways determined to be or
4	the Federal-Aid Urban System as defined in the Federal-Aid Highway Act of
5	1973 and any other public streets jointly selected by the Arkansas State
6	Highway and Transportation Department and responsible municipal officials as
7	determined by the governing body. System mileage and modification will be in
8	accordance with federal directives or concurrent state and municipal action.
9	As used in this subchapter:
10	(1) "Betterment" means any construction or reconstruction on a
11	state aid-designated street that results in an improvement that exceeds or
12	equals any previous improvement whether or not the previous improvement was
13	financed in part or in whole through the provisions of this subchapter;
14	(2)(A) "Construction" means any proposal submitted by a
15	municipality which meets the definition of betterment as opposed to
16	maintenance.
17	(B) "Construction" includes reconstruction or improvement;
18	(3) "Maintenance" means any act of work which maintains the
19	improvement in serviceable condition;
20	(4) "Municipality" means a city of the first class, a city of
21	the second class, or an incorporated town;
22	(5)(A) "State aid" means funds to be expended on state aid
23	streets and includes any sum or sums provided by the General Assembly to
24	supplement funds furnished by the several municipalities for the purpose of
25	constructing, improving, widening, straightening, surfacing, or
26	reconstructing streets or bridges on the state aid system.
27	(B) "State aid" shall be available to the several
28	municipalities in a proportion to be fixed and determined by law; and
29	(6)(A) "State aid streets" means the classification of municipal
30	streets composing the major collector and minor collector routes feeding into
31	local trade areas or into the state highway system that are not designated as
32	state highways.
33	(B) "State aid streets" include those routes that:
34	(i) Are particularly essential to the conservation
35	and development of economic and social value;
36	(ii) Encourage desirable land utilization; and

1	(iii) Have in addition one (1) or more of the
2	following characteristics:
3	(a) Extend to larger communities within and
4	beyond the municipality;
5	(b) Connect with roads of major importance to
6	municipalities or to counties;
7	(c) Connect with state highways to form a
8	complete network of main feeder roads;
9	(d) Carry heavy volumes of traffic serving
10	major business interests of the municipality; or
11	(e) Collect traffic at reasonable intervals
12	from several local streets.
13	(C) "State aid streets" include bridges and ferries.
14	
15	27-72-402. Coordination with state aid road system Establishment —
16	Scope.
17	Every effort will be made to coordinate the establishment of the state
18	aid system with the state aid street system to assure system continuity.
19	(a) A system of state aid streets in each municipality is established
20	to:
21	(1) Consist of the major collector and minor collector routes
22	not on the state highway system feeding into local trade areas or into the
23	state highway system; and
24	(2) Provide a program for the construction and improvement of
25	state aid streets.
26	(b)(l) A state aid system of streets is established for designation by
27	cooperative action of the state and municipalities, as classified and defined
28	in this subchapter.
29	(2) This system shall be designated by the several mayors or
30	chief executive officers of the respective municipalities with the consent
31	and approval of the state aid engineer and the State Highway Commission.
32	(c) This subchapter shall not be construed to deprive or diminish the
33	powers and duties of the mayor or chief executive officer of any municipality
34	in the exercise of his or her constitutional control over municipal streets.
35	
36	27-72-403. Prohibited projects Division of State Aid Road-Street

1	CONSTRUCTION.
2	(a) No funds shall be spent hereunder on any project which shall not
3	culminate directly in a paved hard-surfaced street. None of these funds shall
4	be used for maintenance of state aid streets.
5	(b) Surface overlays of state aid streets are eligible for funding.
6	There is created in the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
7	Department a division to be known as the Division of State Aid Road-Street
8	Construction, subject to the availability and appropriation of funding.
9	
10	27-72-404. Receipt and expenditure of money.
11	Any municipality shall be entitled to receive and to expend state aid
12	street moneys in conjunction with moneys furnished by the municipality or
13	available federal funds on state aid streets within the municipality,
14	provided that:
15	(1) The state aid street system has been designated;
16	(2) The city has a legally adopted improvement code for city
17	street construction or presents a street improvement plan prepared by a
18	registered professional engineer;
19	(3) An annual street improvement program has been approved by
20	the state aid engineer; and
21	(4) The state aid engineer determines that the street
22	improvements are determined to be adequate based on the local conditions and
23	are not in conflict with federal regulations.
24	
25	27-72-405. State aid engineer.
26	The state aid engineer, under the direction of the Director of State
27	Highways and Transportation, shall have the following powers and duties:
28	(1) Supervise and inspect all state aid street projects as the
29	work progresses. Upon final completion of any project, the state aid engineer
30	shall cause a final inspection to be made of such project for the purpose of
31	determining whether the project has been completed satisfactorily in
32	accordance with the plans and specifications. If satisfactorily completed, he
33	shall approve payment of the final estimate on the project. The state aid
34	engineer must certify partial and final completion of municipal street
35	improvement utilizing state aid street funds. No progress or final estimate
36	either on a contract or a force account project shall be paid unless approved

1	in such manner by the state are engineer; and on arr contracts or rorce
2	accounts projects a percentage of ten percent (10%) of each estimate thereon
3	paid shall be retained until final acceptance of such project;
4	(2) Be subject to the direction of the State Highway Commission,
5	provided that both the state aid engineer and the State Highway Commission
6	shall be bound by the provisions hereof;
7	(3) Be responsible for notifying the local municipalities of the
8	state aid street funds that are available for street improvements and
9	certifying payment of the funds when satisfied that street work has been
10	completed by the municipality or by contract; and
11	(4) Prepare and distribute procedures to the various
12	municipalities under which the state aid street funding program will be
13	administered and assist those municipalities desiring aid in developing
14	street improvement standards, but no statewide street specifications will be
15	issued.
16	(a) The Division of State Aid Road-Street Construction of the Arkansas
17	State Highway and Transportation Department shall be headed by a state aid
18	engineer to be appointed by and to serve at the pleasure of the State Highway
19	Commission.
20	(b) The state aid engineer shall be a registered engineer with at
21	least three (3) years' experience as a highway engineer and a thorough
22	knowledge of municipal street problems.
23	(c) The state aid engineer under the direction of the State Highway
24	Commission shall:
25	(1) Advise the mayors and chief executive officers of the
26	several municipalities on all matters of policy, use of funds, uniform
27	standards for state aid streets, safeguards in accounting methods, and other
28	related matters and cooperate with the mayors and chief executive officers or
29	all matters connected with the layout and construction of state aid streets;
30	(2) Promulgate uniform and reasonable rules as he or she may
31	deem necessary to:
32	(A) Effectuate a proper designation of state aid streets
33	to be constructed in each municipality; and
34	(B) Develop the methods for determining priority of
35	construction, the making of surveys, and the preparation of plans and
36	specifications for the construction of state aid streets.

1	(3) Provide a uniform system of accounting in the expenditure of
2	moneys from the State Aid Street Fund;
3	(4)(A) Prepare and promulgate practical uniform design standards
4	and specifications for the construction of state aid streets in such a way as
5	to get the most miles for each dollar, with the prime consideration being to
6	provide economical, utilitarian, paved streets suitable for municipal needs,
7	not to be designed for high speed transportation.
8	(B) The uniform design standards and specifications may be
9	modified or amended from time to time as the state aid engineer deems
10	necessary;
11	(5) Advise and cooperate with the mayors and chief executive
12	officers:
13	(A) In the selection and designation of the municipal
14	streets which are to be made a part of the state aid street system, as
15	provided for in this subchapter; and
16	(B) To approve or disapprove the selection of streets to
17	be made a part of the state aid street system by the respective mayors and
18	chief executive officers;
19	(6) Prepare and submit to the State Highway Commission all
20	proposed contracts to be let for the construction or reconstruction of state
21	aid streets, but before submitting the contracts to the commission, he or she
22	shall submit them to the mayor or chief executive officer of the municipality
23	in which the work is to be performed so that the mayor or chief executive
24	officer may determine that they include in all respects the work the
25	municipality desires to be done in the municipality to be paid from state aid
26	funds; and
27	(7)(A) To personally, or through his or her designated
28	assistants, supervise and inspect all state aid street projects as the work
29	progresses.
30	(B)(i) Upon final completion of any project, the state aid
31	engineer shall cause a final inspection to be made of the project for the
32	purpose of determining whether the project has been completed satisfactorily
33	in accordance with the plans and specifications.
34	(ii) If satisfactorily completed, the state aid
35	engineer shall approve payment of the final estimate on the project.
36	(C)(i) Progress or final estimate either on a contract or

1	a force account project shall not be paid unless approved in such manner by
2	the state aid engineer.
3	(ii) On all contracts or force accounts projects a
4	percentage of ten percent (10%) of each estimate on a project paid shall be
5	retained until final acceptance of such project.
6	(d)(1) The state aid engineer shall be subject to the direction of the
7	State Highway Commission.
8	(2) However, both the state aid engineer and the State Highway
9	Commission shall be bound by the provisions of this section.
10	
11	27-72-406. Notice of municipal eligibility Eligibility for state aid -
12	Notice.
13	When any municipality shall have met the requirements of this
14	subchapter and shall have become eligible for state aid money, the state aid
15	engineer, as soon as practicable, shall notify the municipality in writing of
16	its eligibility and that its proportionate part of any state funds allocated
17	to it for state aid may be utilized for construction or improvement on the
18	state aid street system in the manner provided in this subchapter.
19	(a) Before a municipality is eligible to receive benefits under this
20	subchapter, the municipality through its mayor or chief executive officer
21	shall agree to comply with the terms, provisions, and limitations of this
22	subchapter.
23	(b)(1) When a municipality meets the requirements of this subchapter
24	and is eligible for state aid, the state aid engineer, as soon as
25	practicable, shall notify the eligible municipality in writing.
26	(2) The notice shall state that any state funds allocated to the
27	municipality for state aid may be used for construction on the state aid
28	system in the manner provided in this subchapter.
29	
30	27-72-407. State Aid Street Account Fund.
31	There is created a State Aid Street Account of the State Highway and
32	Transportation Department Fund, which shall consist of those federal general
33	revenue-sharing moneys allocated and distributed in accordance with laws
34	enacted by the General Assembly and there to be used as provided by the
35	provisions of this subchapter, as amended.
36	(a)(1) There is created in the State Treasury, subject to the

- 1 availability and appropriation of funding, a fund to be known as the State
- 2 Aid Street Fund, to which the Treasurer of State shall transfer one hundred
- 3 percent (100%) of the revenues credited to the State Highway Special
- 4 Construction Account of the State Highway and Transportation Department Fund
- 5 each month until an aggregate total of up to twenty-one million dollars
- 6 (\$21,000,000) each fiscal year is transferred, there to be used for
- 7 construction, reconstruction, and improvements of the state aid street
- 8 system.
- 9 (2) For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and for all
- 10 <u>fiscal years thereafter</u>, there shall be no limitation on the amount of funds
- 11 that may be transferred to the State Aid Street Fund from the designated
- 12 <u>funding source</u>.
- 13 (b)(1) All revenues deposited in the State Aid Street Fund shall be
- 14 apportioned to the municipalities as prescribed in § 27-72-413 for the
- 15 <u>distribution on the state aid street system among the various municipalities.</u>
- 16 (2) The apportioned funds shall remain for a period of two (2)
- 17 years from the date they are apportioned.
- 18 (3) Any unused funds shall be returned to the State Aid Street
- 19 Fund for redistribution in accordance with § 27-72-413.
- 20 (4)(A) For a municipality to receive these funds, the
- 21 municipality must be matched in the ratio of ninety percent (90%) of moneys
- 22 from the State Aid Street Fund to not less than ten percent (10%) municipal
- 23 matching funds for all municipalities with a population in excess of twenty-
- 24 <u>five thousand (25,000) residents.</u>
- 25 <u>(B) For all other municipalities, the state aid street</u>
- 26 project shall be funded at one hundred percent (100%), and all municipalities
- 27 receiving moneys from the State Aid Street Fund shall comply with the
- 28 provisions of this subchapter.

- 30 27-72-408. Apportionment and transfer of funds.
- 31 (a) Apportionment of state aid street funds, as provided in § 27-72-
- 32 407, shall be based upon the ratio that the population of each municipality
- 33 bears to the total municipal population in the state, as determined by the
- 34 last available census. However, no municipality shall be apportioned more
- 35 than ten percent (10%) of the revenues.
- 36 (b) The balance of revenue-sharing and other funds in the State Aid

- Street Account standing to the credit of any municipality that does not have a project on which work is underway on April 1, 1981, or provisions made therefor, under the provisions of this subchapter shall be transferred to the street fund of that municipality, there to be used for the construction, maintenance, or repair of the streets of the municipality in such manner as the municipality shall deem appropriate and in accordance with pertinent federal laws and regulations. The municipality shall be forever released from further obligation to the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department under the provisions of this subchapter.
 - (c) Following completion of the work and final payment of all allowable costs on each municipality's projects that were in progress on or after April 1, 1981, under the provisions of this subchapter, the outstanding revenue-sharing and other moneys remaining in the State Aid Street Account to the credit of the municipality shall be transferred to the street fund of that municipality, there to be used for the construction, maintenance, or repair of the streets of the municipality in such a manner as the municipality shall deem appropriate and in accordance with pertinent federal laws and regulations. The municipality shall be forever released from further obligation to the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department under the provisions of this subchapter.
 - (d) In the event that revenue sharing money shall become available to the municipalities under the provisions of this subchapter subsequent to the calendar year 1981, then the moneys shall be apportioned to the municipalities as above provided and paid to the municipalities in the same manner and for the same purposes as provided herein for the funds credited to the municipalities on April 1, 1981.

27-72-409. Prerequisite for allocations from account.

Except as otherwise provided in § 27-72-408(a), for a municipality to receive funds available in the State Aid Street Account of the State Highway and Transportation Department Fund, the funds must be matched in a ratio of seventy percent (70%) state aid street funds to not less than thirty percent (30%) municipal matching funds, and the municipality must comply with all provisions in this subchapter.

27-72-410. Expenditure requirements.

1	Expenditure of funds credited to the State Aid Street Account of the
2	State Highway and Transportation Department Fund shall be in the following
3	manner:
4	(1) The combined state and municipal funds may be utilized as
5	matching funds for acquiring additional federal aid funding for street work,
6	unless specifically prohibited by federal law;
7	(2) All rights-of-way required on state aid street projects
8	shall be acquired by the municipality, and any cost of rights-of-way shall
9	not be considered a part of the cost of any project contemplated by this
10	subchapter;
11	(3) No state aid street funds shall be released to the
12	municipality until the municipality executes an annual agreement that the
13	thirty percent (30%) matching share will be available and that the state aid
14	street funds and matching funds will be carried as a special item on the
15	municipal budget and utilized exclusively for street improvements authorized
16	under this subchapter;
17	(4) Eligible street improvements can be performed by municipal
18	forces or by contract administered by the municipality or Arkansas State
19	Highway and Transportation Department. However, any projects in excess of
20	fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) shall be submitted to bid, and the lowest
21	responsible bid shall be accepted; and
22	(5) The state aid street funds will be provided on a seventy
23	percent (70%) cost-reimbursable basis as progress vouchers are issued or
24	after the project is complete.
25	
26	27-72-411. Street maintenance by municipality — Failure to maintain.
27	(a) It shall be the duty of each municipality to properly maintain all
28	state aid streets within its jurisdiction that have been constructed or
29	improved with state aid street funds.
30	(b) Failure to maintain such streets to an acceptable level determined
31	by the state aid engineer can result in denial of future state aid street
32	funds.
33	(a) It is the duty of each municipality to properly maintain all state
34	aid streets in that municipality after construction of any such streets with
35	state aid moneys.

(b)(l) If, in the opinion of the state aid engineer, essential

36

1	maintenance is not properly and regularly carried on, notice of the
2	deficiency shall be given in writing to the mayor or chief executive officer.
3	(2) If maintenance is not initiated within sixty (60) days from
4	date of notice, the state aid engineer may proceed to have the necessary
5	maintenance and repair work on the street performed and charge the work to
6	any funds in the State Aid Street Fund in the State Treasury allocated to
7	that municipality.
8	(3)(A) If failure to maintain continues, the municipality is no
9	longer eligible for state aid until proper maintenance is resumed by that
10	municipality.
11	(B) Notice of withdrawal of state aid shall be duly given
12	the Auditor of State and Treasurer of State.
13	(C) However, such ineligibility shall not affect payment
14	from the State Aid Street Fund of progress and final estimates on contracts
15	awarded prior to notice of ineligibility.
16	(c) Whenever a municipality is ineligible for state aid under the
17	provisions of this subchapter for a continuous period of five (5) years, the
18	municipality shall forfeit and no longer be entitled to any part of the funds
19	in the State Aid Street Fund later allocated to it.
20	
21	27-72-412. Expenses paid prior to allocation.
22	The pro rata salaries of the state aid engineer, his or her assistants,
23	and all other employees of the Division of State Aid Road-Street Construction
24	of the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department, as well as all
25	other expenses incurred by the Division of State Aid Road-Street Construction
26	pertaining to the state aid street program, shall be paid from the State Aid
27	Street Fund in the State Treasury prior to allocation to the several
28	municipalities.
29	
30	27-72-413. Allocation of state aid.
31	(a) State aid streets in the several municipalities shall receive
32	state aid in the manner and under the terms and conditions set out in this
33	section.
34	(b) The state aid street system shall be allocated to the several
35	municipalities of the state by the State Aid Street Committee.

(c)(1) The committee shall be established to select the state aid

1	street projects for submittal to the state aid engineer for funding and
2	construction pursuant to the provisions of this subchapter.
3	(2) The committee shall consist of nine (9) mayors to be
4	appointed as follows:
5	(A) Three (3) mayors appointed by the Governor;
6	(B) Three (3) mayors appointed by the Speaker of the House
7	of Representatives; and
8	(C) Three (3) mayors appointed by the President Pro
9	Tempore of the Senate.
10	(3)(A) Each appointed mayor shall serve a term of four (4)
11	years.
12	(B) A mayor shall be eligible to serve two (2) terms of
13	four (4) years on the committee.
14	(C) However, every four (4) years a new committee shall be
15	formed as set out in this section.
16	(D) Should a mayor selected for the committee leave office
17	before the end of his or her term, the party who made the original nomination
18	shall appoint a successor mayor to serve the remainder of the term.
19	(4) The committee shall select a chair by majority vote to serve
20	a term of one (1) year.
21	(5) A quorum is necessary to transact the business of the
22	<pre>committee.</pre>
23	(6) Subject to the availability and appropriation of funding,
24	the committee shall begin to meet and meet at least quarterly each year.
25	(d) The committee may establish a formula or criteria to facilitate
26	the identification and selection of state aid street projects, subject to the
27	approval of the state aid engineer and consistent with the provisions of this
28	subchapter.
29	(e) All state aid street projects proposed by a municipality shall
30	meet the requirements of § 27-72-406, § 27-72-415, and § 27-72-417 of this
31	subchapter before the committee may consider the projects for submission to
32	the state aid engineer.
33	
34	27-72-414. Contracts for work to be performed.
35	(a) All proposals covering work to be performed on state aid streets
36	in a municipality in this state shall be:

1	(1) Under contract let and approved by the State Highway
2	Commission upon a request from the mayor or chief executive officer of the
3	municipality; and
4	(2) In accordance with the procedures prescribed in § 27-67-206,
5	and other laws of this state pertaining to contracts for the construction of
6	state highways, which shall be equally applicable to all contracts let by the
7	commission for the construction of state aid streets under this subchapter.
8	(b)(1) The mayor or chief executive officer of a municipality is
9	authorized to submit bids for work to be performed on state aid streets under
10	the provisions of this subchapter.
11	(2) This section shall not be construed to limit or restrict the
12	right of a mayor or chief executive officer to submit bids for work to be
13	performed by municipal forces so long as the bids are:
14	(A) In accordance with procedures of § 27-67-206; and
15	(B) The aggregate cost does not exceed one hundred sixty-
16	five thousand dollars (\$165,000).
17	
18	27-72-415. Conditions for use of state aid.
19	A municipality is entitled to receive state aid and to expend state aid
20	moneys in conjunction with moneys furnished by the municipality on state aid
21	streets in the municipality on projects approved for construction in the
22	municipality provided:
23	(1) The state aid system in the municipality has been designated
24	and approved as provided in this subchapter;
25	(2)(A) The municipality has employed or retained an engineer who
26	is a registered professional engineer to act for and on behalf of the
27	municipality as a whole.
28	(B) However:
29	(i) If any mayor or chief executive officer is a
30	registered professional engineer, the mayor or chief executive officer may
31	perform the duties provided under this section for the municipal engineer;
32	<u>and</u>
33	(ii) A municipality may contract with the Arkansas
34	State Highway and Transportation Department for engineering services in lieu
35	of employing or retaining a municipal engineer.
36	(C) The cost of employing or retaining a municipal

1	engineer or contracting with the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
2	Department for engineering services shall be paid from the municipal street
3	funds of the municipality and shall not be payable from the State Aid Street
4	Fund.
5	(D) Engineering costs on federal-aid projects may be
6	included as a cost item of the projects; and
7	(3) The municipality has complied with all rules promulgated by
8	the state aid engineer.
9	
10	27-72-416. Use of state aid.
11	(a) Funds deposited in the State Aid Street Fund shall be used
12	$\underline{\text{exclusively}}$ for the construction, reconstruction, and improvements of $\underline{\text{streets}}$
13	or bridges on the state aid street system, except as otherwise provided in
14	this subchapter.
15	(b) The funds shall not be spent under this subchapter on any project
16	which shall not culminate directly in a paved hard-surfaced street.
17	(c) The funds shall not be used for maintenance of state aid streets.
18	(d)(1) All expenditures from the State Aid Street Fund under this
19	subchapter shall be made after publication of:
20	(A) Notice to bidders of the date for final reception of
21	bids; and
22	(B) The address at which specifications can be acquired.
23	(2) After a public opening of the bids, all contracts shall be
24	awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.
25	
26	27-72-417. Rights-of-way - Exception.
27	(a)(1) All rights-of-way required on state aid street projects shall
28	be acquired by the municipality.
29	(2) Any cost of rights-of-way or utility relocation shall not be
30	considered a part of the cost of a project contemplated by this subchapter.
31	(b) The cost of reconstructing fencing and the construction of
32	property access passages shall not be considered as rights-of-way costs but
33	shall be considered as a component of project cost.
34	
35	27-72-418. Municipal highway revenue estimates.
36	(a)(1) For each fiscal year, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State

1	shall prepare and file quarterly statements setting forth an estimate of the
2	total amount of highway revenues and other state revenues made available by
3	this subchapter and all other laws providing state resources for and to
4	municipal governments for street construction, improvements, and betterments
5	made within the spirit of this subchapter, for the express use of the several
6	municipalities of the state.
7	(2) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall prepare and file
8	the statement on or before July 10, October 10, January 10, and April 10 of
9	each fiscal year.
10	(b)(1) Each statement shall be designated and known as the "Official
11	Estimate of Municipal Highway Revenues Distribution" for the then-current
12	fiscal year.
13	(2) Copies shall be filed with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
14	State, the Auditor of State, the Treasurer of State, and the Arkansas
15	Municipal League.
16	(c)(l) In preparing each official estimate of municipal highway
17	revenues distribution, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall begin with
18	a basic amount arrived at in the manner prescribed under this subsection.
19	(2) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall add or subtract
20	his or her estimate of the net increase or net decrease in municipal street
21	funds as may be affected by various factors, as determined by the Chief
22	Fiscal Officer of the State, including without limitation:
23	(A) Changes in the laws pertaining to tax rates and
24	exemptions;
25	(B) Administration of tax laws;
26	(C) Indexing; and
27	(D) Distribution of revenues.
28	(3) The basic amount of municipal street funds shall be
29	ascertained as follows:
30	(A) The July estimate shall be the amount of the next-
31	preceding fiscal year's municipal street funds, increased or decreased by
32	that certain percentage determined by the average of percentage changes in
33	the amount of the total municipal street funds by legislated source category
34	of each of the three (3) preceding fiscal years in relation to its preceding
35	fiscal year; and

(B) The October, January, and April estimates shall be the

1	total amount of municipal street funds by legislated source category
2	collected in the preceding months of the then-current fiscal year plus the
3	total amount of municipal street funds by legislated source category
4	collected in all of the other months of the preceding fiscal year, increased
5	or decreased by that certain percentage determined by the average of
6	percentage changes in the collections during all other months of each of the
7	three (3) preceding fiscal years in relation to the same other months of its
8	preceding fiscal years.

10	27-72-419. Title.
11	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "State Aid
12	Streets Law".
13	
14	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
15	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that city streets are in an extreme
16	state of disrepair, particularly in rural municipalities; that municipalities
17	are without an adequate program or adequate funding to allow for significant,
18	long-term, corrective action to repair their streets; and that this act is
19	$\underline{\text{necessary to initiate a program of remediation for municipal streets with } \mathbf{the}$
20	involvement and consent of the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
21	Department so that municipalities can increase the prospects of economic and
22	social development across the state by improving their streets. Therefore,
23	an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the
24	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
25	on July 1, 2011.
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
