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11	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
12	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is the state's
13	constitutional obligation to provide a general, suitable, and efficient free
14	system of public schools in the state; that the public school funding
15	distribution changes in this act are needed to ensure that proper funding is
16	provided to public schools and school districts; and that this act is
17	immediately necessary so that public schools and school districts will
18	receive the amount of funding provided under this act for the 2011-2012
19	school year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
20	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
21	safety shall become effective on July 1, 2011.
