13	(a)(1) Beginning July 1, 2012, the parent of an eligible student may		
14	apply for <i>funding</i> under this subchapter.		
15	(2) The application form and process shall be prescribed by		
16	rules of the State Board of Education.		
17	(b) The parent shall submit with the application evidence satisfactory		
18	to the Department of Education of the eligible student's successful		
19	completion of the school year immediately preceding the date of the		
20	application, including without limitation that:		
21	(1) With respect to a home-schooled student:

36	(a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, the Department of		

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1	Education shall pay to the parent of an eligible student an amount equal to		
2	one-half (1/2) of the foundation funding amount set by the General Assembly		
3	in § 6-20-2305 for the school year upon which the parent's application is		
4	based.		
5	(b) A parent shall only use <i>the funding provided</i> under this subchapter		
6	<u>for:</u>		
7	(1) Academic expenditures for home-schooling of the student; or		
8	(2) Private school tuition and books.		
9	(c)(1) The department shall provide the funding under this section

32	district under a provision of the Arkansas Code; and

34	fulfills the requirements established by the state board under the Standards

36	(iii) Open-enrollment public charter school students
