33	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-48-203(d), concerning certification of
34	surveyor interns, is amended to read as follows:
35	(d) Effective January 1, 2017, an applicant for licensure as a
36	surveyor intern shall qualify under one (1) of the following provisions:

1	(1)(A) A graduate holding or a student enrolled in the last year
2	of a program leading to a baccalaureate degree from a curriculum of four (4)
3	years or more $\frac{1}{2}$ has
4	credit hours, or the board-approved equivalent approved by the board, in
5	courses approved by the board involving land surveying, mapping, and real
6	property as approved by the board shall be admitted to sit for a written
7	examination in a form approved by the board.
8	(B) An applicant who is otherwise qualified shall be
9	granted licensure as a surveyor intern upon on:
10	(i) passing Passing the written examination; and
11	(ii) Providing proof of graduation with a board-
12	approved baccalaureate degree; or
13	(2)(A) A graduate holding or student enrolled in the last year
14	of a program leading to an associate of science or an associate of applied
15	science degree in surveying or an associate of applied science in surveying
16	degree from a program approved by the board or its equivalent shall be
17	admitted to sit for a written examination in a form approved by the board.
18	(B) An applicant who is otherwise qualified shall be
19	granted licensure as a surveyor intern upon <u>on:</u>
20	(i) passing Passing the written examination; and
21	(ii) Providing proof of graduation with a board-
22	approved associate of science or associate of applied science degree.

24	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-48-204(d), concerning reinstatement of a
25	surveyor license, is amended to read as follows:
26	(d) A professional surveyor or surveyor intern whose certificate of
27	licensure has not been <u>is not</u> renewed may have it reinstated by meeting all
28	the requirements of the board including, depending on the time of nonrenewal
29	under the rules of the board. The requirements the board may consider are:
30	(1) Payment of fees <u>and penalties</u> ;
31	(2) Payment of applicable penalties;
32	(3) Demonstration of continuing professional competency; and
33	(4)(3) Reexamination.
34	
35	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-48-205 is amended to read as follows:
36	17-48-205 Reveation Administrative violations and penalties

1	The State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and
2	Professional Surveyors shall revoke the license of a professional surveyor or
3	surveyor intern if after a hearing the board finds that the professional
4	surveyor or surveyor intern:
5	(1) Secured his or her license through the practice of fraud or
6	deceit or through false statements made in his or her application for his or
7	her license in any document subsequently filed or in any oral testimony
8	subsequently given in support of the applications;
9	(2) Has been guilty of any gross negligence, incompetence, or
10	misconduct in the practice of land surveying; or
11	(3) Has been convicted of any felony or crime involving moral
12	turpitude.
13	(a) The State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and
14	Professional Surveyors may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue, restore, or
15	renew a certificate of licensure of, or place on probation, fine, reprimand a
16	professional surveyor who is:
17	(1) Found guilty of:
18	(A) Fraud or deceit in obtaining, attempting to obtain, or
19	renewing a certificate of licensure or certificate of authorization;
20	(B) Negligence, incompetency, or misconduct in the
21	<pre>practice of surveying;</pre>
22	(C) Failure to comply with this chapter, the rules of the
23	board, or an order of the board;
24	(D) Discipline by another state, territory, the District
25	of Columbia, a foreign, the United States Government, or any other
26	governmental agency, if at least one (1) of the grounds for discipline is the
27	same or substantially equivalent to those contained in this section;
28	(E) Failure within thirty (30) days to provide information
29	requested by the board as a result of a formal or informal complaint to the
30	board that would indicate a violation of this chapter;
31	(F) Knowingly making false statements or signing false
32	statements, certificates, or affidavits to induce payment;
33	(G) Aiding or assisting another person in violating this
34	chapter or the rules of the board;
35	(H) Violating a term of probation imposed by the board;
36	(I) Using a seal or practicing surveying while the

1	professional surveyor's license is suspended, revoked, non-renewed, or
2	inactive;
3	(J) Signing, affixing the professional surveyor's seal, or
4	permitting the professional surveyor's seal or signature to be affixed to an
5	instrument of practice that has not been prepared or completely checked by
6	the professional surveyor or under the professional surveyor's direct
7	supervision or control;
8	(J) Engaging in dishonorable, unethical, or unprofessional
9	conduct of character likely to deceive, defraud, or harm the public;
10	(K) Providing false testimony or information to the board
11	<u>or</u>
12	(L) Habitual intoxication or addiction to the use of drugs
13	or alcohol;
14	(2) Found guilty of or enters a plea of guilty or nolo
15	<pre>contendere to:</pre>
16	(A) A felony;
17	(B) A crime of which an essential element is dishonesty;
18	<u>or</u>
19	(C) A crime that is directly related to the practice of
20	surveying. or
21	(3) Subject to disciplinary action by another state, territory,
22	the District of Columbia, a foreign country, the United States government, or
23	other governmental agency, if at least one (1) of the grounds for discipline
24	is the same or substantially equivalent to those contained in this section.
25	(b) The board may take the following action against a professional
26	surveyor:
27	(1) Suspend or revoke a certificate of licensure;
28	(2) Refuse to issue, restore, or renew a certificate of
29	licensure;
30	(3) Place on probation, impose a fine, or reprimand; or
31	(4) A combination of the above.
32	(c) A person that violates this chapter or a rule of the board shall
33	pay a civil penalty to the board of not more than five thousand dollars
34	(\$5,000) for each offense.
35	(d)(1) The board shall adopt rules of professional conduct under §17-
36	48-104 that are to be provided to an applicant for licensure

1	(2) The board may amend these rules of professional conduct from
2	time to time and shall notify each licensee in writing of the amendments.
3	(e) The board may:
4	(1) Revoke a certificate of authorization;
5	(2) Suspend a certificate of authorization for a time not
6	exceeding two (2) years of a firm when one (1) or more of its officers or
7	directors have been found guilty of conduct that would authorize a revocation
8	or suspension of their certificates of licensure under this section;
9	(3) Place a firm on probation for a period and subject to the
10	conditions as the board may specify; or
11	(4) Levy a fine in an amount not more than five thousand dollars
12	(\$5,000) for each offense.
13	(f) The board may levy of a fine in an amount not more than five
14	thousand dollars (\$5,000) for each offense against non-licensees that violate
15	this chapter.

17	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-48-206 is amended to read as follows:
18	17-48-206. Continuing education requirements.
19	(a)(1)(A) After the expiration of the two-year period immediately
20	following the effective date of the adoption of regulations by the State
21	Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Professional Surveyors
22	establishing requirements of continuing education, every application for
23	renewal of a certificate of licensure under this section shall be accompanied
24	or supported by such evidence as the board prescribes documenting the
25	completion of fifteen (15) hours of acceptable continuing education, approved
26	by the board, during the twelve-month period immediately preceding the date
27	of application.
28	(B) Failure by an applicant to provide this evidence
29	constitutes grounds for revocation, suspension, or refusal to renew the
30	permit unless the board, in its discretion, determines the failure is due to
31	reasonable cause or the applicant was not engaged in the practice of land
32	surveying and maintained his or her initial certificate of licensure under §
33	17-48-204(c).
34	$(2)(\Lambda)$ In its discretion, the board may renew a certificate of
35	licensure despite the failure to furnish evidence of satisfaction of
36	requirements of continuing education and may issue a certificate of licensure

T	to an applicant who has previously maintained inactive status under § 17-48-
2	204(c) upon the condition that the applicant follow a particular program or
3	schedule of continuing education.
4	(B) In issuing rules, regulations, and individual orders
5	in respect to requirements of continuing education, in its discretion the
6	board:
7	(i) May, among other things, use and rely upon
8	guidelines and pronouncements of recognized educational and professional
9	associations;
10	(ii) May prescribe content, duration, and
11	organization of courses;
12	(iii) Shall take into account the accessibility to
13	applicants of such continuing education as it may require; and
14	(iv) May provide for relaxation or suspension of
15	requirements in regard to applicants who certify that they do not intend to
16	engage in the practice of land surveyors and for instances of individual
17	hardship.
18	(3) In its discretion, the board may exempt licensed
19	professional surveyors sixty (60) years of age or with twenty (20) or more
20	years' experience as practicing professional surveyors within this state from
21	the provisions of this subsection.
22	(b)(1) The board may prescribe regulations, procedures, and policies
23	in the manner and condition under which credit shall be given for
24	participation in a program of continuing education that the board may deem
25	necessary and appropriate to maintain the highest standard of proficiency in
26	the profession of land surveying.
27	(2) Examples of programs of continuing education that are
28	acceptable include, without limitation programs or seminars sponsored by
29	higher educational institutions, government agencies, professional
30	organizations of registered land surveyors, and related professions.
31	17-48-206. Continuing education requirements.
32	(a)(1) The State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and
33	Professional Surveyors shall issue rules establishing the continuing
34	education requirements for professional surveyors and surveyor-interns.
35	(2) The rules shall take into account the accessibility to
36	applicants of the board's continuing education requirements.

1	(5) The rules may:
2	(A) Rely upon guidelines and pronouncements of recognized
3	educational and professional associations;
4	(B) Prescribe the content, duration, and organization of
5	courses;
6	(C) Provide for the relaxation or suspension of
7	requirements for:
8	(i) Applicants who certify that they do not intend
9	to engage in the practice of surveying; and
10	(ii) Instances of individual hardship;

19	that are acceptable include without limitation programs or seminars sponsored
20	by higher educational institutions, government agencies, and professional
21	surveying organizations and related professions.
22	(b)(1) An application for renewal of a certificate of licensure shall
23	be accompanied by evidence documenting the completion of acceptable
24	continuing education credit during the previous renewal period.
25	(2) Failure by an applicant to provide this evidence upon
26	request by the board is grounds for disciplinary action unless the board
27	determines the failure is due to a reasonable cause or the applicant was not
28	engaged in the practice of surveying during the previous renewal period.
29	(3) The board may renew a certificate of licensure despite an
30	applicant's failure to furnish satisfactory evidence of meeting continuing
31	education requirements and may issue a certificate of licensure to an
32	applicant who has previously maintained inactive status under § 17-48-204(c)
33	if the applicant follows a particular program or schedule of continuing
34	education prescribed by the board.

36	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 48, Subchapter 2 is amended

2	17-48-208. Disciplinary action - Procedures.
3	(a) The rules promulgated by the State Board of Licensure for
4	Professional Engineers and Professional Surveyors for disciplinary procedures
5	shall be based on and consistent with the model rules of procedure of the
6	Attorney General.
7	(b) A charge, unless dismissed or settled informally, is to be heard
8	by the board within twelve (12) months after the date on which the charge was
9	submitted.
10	(c)(1) A fine or civil penalty not paid within fifty (50) days after
11	the order becomes final is a judgment.
12	(2) The order is to be filed as a judgment and executed in the
13	same manner as other judgments.
14	(d) The board, on petition of an individual licensee or firm holding a
15	certificate of authorization, may reissue a certificate of licensure or
16	authorization if a majority of the members of the board vote for the
17	issuance.
