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1 the 2002-2003 academic year, any public school student who graduates from a 2 public high school after May 1, 2002, must have successfully completed the core curriculum recommended by the coordinating board Arkansas Higher 3 4 Education Coordinating Board after consultation with the state board State 5 Board of Education and <del>pursuant to</del> under § 6-61-217 in order to be eligible 6 for unconditional admission to a public state-supported two-year institution 7 of higher education.

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(2) Nothing in this subsection (b) shall prevent a student from 9 enrolling for the purpose of obtaining a degree or a certificate offered by a 10 public two-year institution.

11 (c)(1)(A) The colleges and universities shall develop standards for 12 collegiate admissions based on the mission of each institution and establish 13 a conditional collegiate admissions process for each institution, subject to 14 the recommendations of the coordinating board Arkansas Higher Education 15 Coordinating Board.

16 (B) The colleges and universities are hereby directed to 17 shall establish standards for conditional admission for public school 18 students who have not completed the core curriculum, subject to the 19 recommendations of the coordinating board Arkansas Higher Education 20 Coordinating Board. At a minimum, these conditional admissions standards 21 shall require the following:

22 (i) For a public school student seeking an associate 23 of arts degree or a baccalaureate degree who failed to successfully complete 24 the core curriculum, completion of twelve (12) hours of core academic courses 25 and any necessary remedial courses with a cumulative grade point average of 26 2.0 on a 4.0 scale; or

27 (ii) For a public school student seeking a diploma, 28 a technical certificate, or an associate of applied science degree who failed 29 to successfully complete the core curriculum, completion of six (6) hours of core academic courses, six (6) hours of technical courses required for the 30 31 diploma, technical certificate, or associate of applied science degree, and any necessary remedial courses with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 32 33 on a 4.0 scale.

34 (2)(A) Conditional admissions standards should shall 35 appropriately reflect the mission of each institution and shall be 36 implemented by the institutions as a condition of for receiving state funds.

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## (B) If the <del>coordinating board</del> <u>Arkansas Higher Education</u> <u>Coordinating Board</u> does not approve the conditional collegiate admissions

3 standards and process for an institution, no state funds shall not be used to 4 subsidize or pay for any portion of the cost associated with the conditional 5 students.

6 (3) The admissions criteria set forth in this section shall not 7 apply to those individuals who graduate from a public high school prior to 8 May 1, 2002.

9 (d)(1) Beginning with the 1997-1998 academic year, conditional 10 <u>Conditional</u> admissions standards for nontraditional students shall be based 11 on the student's score on the American College Test composite or its 12 equivalent as defined by the Department of Higher Education, which shall 13 issue guidelines to assist two-year and four-year institutions of higher 14 education in developing conditional admissions standards.

15 (2) As used in this subsection (d), "nontraditional students"
16 shall include those who are home-schooled or who attended private or
17 parochial secondary schools.

18 (e) Nothing in this This section shall not prevent an institution of
19 higher education from setting higher admissions standards for enrolling
20 freshmen.

21 (f) Nothing in this section shall prevent a student from enrolling for 22 the purpose of obtaining a degree or a certificate offered by a public two-23 year or four-year institution of higher education.

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
