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1 to extinguish, control, or contain fire and so provide protection from 2 exposure to fire or the products of combustion; and 3 (B) A standpipe and hose system as defined under the 4 provisions of National Fire Protection Association pamphlet number fourteen 5 (No. 14); 6 (4)(3) "Fire protection sprinkler system business" means those 7 firms engaged in the planning, fire protection layout, selling, installing, 8 maintaining, inspecting, and or servicing of fire protection sprinkler 9 systems, including without limitation standpipes, hose stations, and fire 10 pumps; 11 (5)(4) "Fire protection sprinkler systems inspector" means a 12 qualified person who: 13 (A) who is Is employed full time by a licensed fire 14 protection sprinkler contractor in the State of Arkansas and who has met the 15 requirements to perform inspections of fire protection sprinkler systems in 16 accordance with this subchapter; and 17 (B) May perform corrections of deficiencies from an 18 inspection; 19 (6)(5) "Firm" means any person, partnership, corporation, or 20 association; (7)(6) "Fixed fire protection systems" means those fire 21 22 extinguisher or fire suppression systems, including without limitation: 23 (A) Those fire Fire extinguishing or fire suppression 24 systems installed to protect the hoods and ductwork of exhaust systems 25 designed for the removal of smoke and grease-laden vapors from commercial 26 cooking equipment; and 27 (B) Those listed Listed or approved fire protection 28 systems or suppression systems installed and maintained according to the 29 standards adopted in the rules of the Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing 30 Board; 31 (8)(7) "Hydrostatic testing" means pressure testing by 32 hydrostatic methods; 33 (9) "NICET" means the National Institute for the Certification 34 in Engineering Technologies; 35 (10)(8) "Portable fire extinguisher" means any device that 36 contains within it chemicals, fluids, powder, liquids, or gases for

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1 extinguishing fires; 2 (9) "Qualified person" means a person meeting the qualifications 3 under § 20-22-611; 4 (11)(10) "Responsible managing employee" means an individual who 5 is a full-time licensed employee of a registered fire protection sprinkler 6 system business firm and who is designated by the firm fire protection 7 sprinkler system business to be responsible for assuring that all 8 installations and servicing of fire protection sprinkler systems are 9 performed in accordance with all applicable provisions, rules, and 10 guidelines; and 11 (12)(11) "Service and servicing" means physically installing 12 portable fire extinguishers, fixed fire protection systems, or fire 13 protection sprinkler systems by charging, filling, maintaining, recharging, 14 refilling, repairing, hanging, locating, or retesting the portable fire 15 extinguisher, fixed fire protection system, or fire protection sprinkler 16 system; and 17 (12)(A) "Sprinkler fitter" means a qualified person to oversee: (i) An apprentice; or 18 (ii) The initial installation or servicing of fire 19 20 protection sprinkler systems. 21 (B) A sprinkler fitter may perform corrections of 22 deficiencies from an inspection. 23 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 20-22-604(c), concerning penalties issued by 24 25 the Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board, is amended to read as follows: 26 (c) The board may require a firm to pay all necessary and proper costs 27 incurred by the board in the preparation, conduct, and findings of a hearing 28 involving correcting the action or work performed by the board in violation 29 of a statute, rule, or order enforceable by the board. 30 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 20-22-607 is amended to read as follows: 31 32 20-22-607. Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board - Powers and 33 duties. The Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board shall: 34 35 (1) Formulate and administer policies as may be determined 36 necessary for the protection and preservation of life and property in regard

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1 to: 2 (A) The registration of firms engaging in the business of 3 installing, inspecting, or servicing, or both, portable fire extinguishers 4 and of firms engaging or in the business of installing, inspecting, and 5 servicing fixed fire protection systems; 6 (B) The registration of firms engaging in the business of 7 hydrostatic testing of portable fire extinguishers. However, no person or 8 firm shall be granted a Class A hydrostatic testing certificate until the 9 applicant submits proof satisfactory to the board that the test equipment of 10 the applicant has been tested and certified by the United States Department 11 of Transportation; 12 (C) The examination and licensure of persons applying for 13 a license to install, inspect, or service, or both, portable fire 14 extinguishers and of a person applying for a license to install, inspect, or 15 service, or both, fixed fire protection systems; 16 (D) The registration of firms engaging in the business of 17 selling, system layout, installing, servicing, inspecting, or any aspect of 18 fire protection sprinkler systems, including standpipe, fire pumps, and hose 19 systems; 20 The examination and licensure of a person applying for (E) 21 a license as a responsible managing employee for the purpose of fire 22 protection sprinkler system business, including designing, inspecting, 23 installing, system layout, or servicing fire protection sprinkler systems, 24 including standpipe, fire pumps, and hose systems; and 25 (F) The examination and licensure of a person applying for 26 a license as a fire protection sprinkler systems inspector for the purpose of 27 installing, servicing, or inspecting fire protection sprinkler systems, 28 including standpipe, fire pumps, and hose systems; and 29 (G) The examination and licensure of a person applying for 30 a license as a fire protection sprinkler system sprinkler fitter or apprentice for the purpose of installing, servicing, or placing fire 31 protection sprinkler systems in service, including without limitation 32 standpipe, fire pumps, and hose systems; 33 34 Establish reasonable qualifications for firms and (2) 35 individuals for the issuance of a certificate of registration or individual 36 license to engage in any aspect of the business of portable fire

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1 extinguishers, fixed fire protection systems, or fire protection sprinkler
2 systems;

3 (3) Conduct examinations to ascertain the qualifications and
4 fitness of individual applicants to install or service portable fire
5 extinguishers, install or service fixed fire protection systems, or install,
6 service, inspect, or design fire protection sprinkler systems;

7 (4) Issue certificates of registration for those firms that 8 qualify and individual licenses and permits to individuals that qualify to 9 engage in the business and activity of installing and servicing portable fire 10 extinguishers, installing and servicing fixed fire protection systems, and 11 designing, installing, inspecting, or servicing fire protection sprinkler 12 systems and issue licenses or permits to those firms and individuals 13 qualifying to perform hydrostatic testing of fire extinguisher cylinders;

14 (5) Evaluate the qualifications of firms seeking approval as15 testing laboratories for portable fire extinguishers; and

16 (6)(A) Regulate and license as a part of a fire protection
17 sprinkler system the installation, service, and maintenance of a standpipe
18 and hose system as defined under the National Fire Protection Association
19 pamphlet number fourteen (No. 14).

(B)(i) The installation, service, and maintenance of a standpipe and hose system shall be performed by a licensed fire protection sprinkler contractor. A licensed fire protection sprinkler contractor is not required to perform hydrostatic testing of the standpipe hose, repair of the standpipe hose, or maintenance of the standpipe hose.

25 The standpipe and hose system shall be: (ii) 26 (a) Designed, installed, and tested in 27 accordance with the standards adopted in the "Rules and Regulations 28 Applicable to Fire Protection Sprinkler Systems" of the board and $_{T}$ in 29 accordance with the applicable National Fire Protection Association 30 pamphlets; and 31 (b) Designed by an Arkansas-licensed 32 responsible managing employee or a registered professional engineer licensed 33 by the State of Arkansas.

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35 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 20-22-609 is amended to read as follows:
 36 20-22-609. License, permit, or certificate required - Compliance with

1 subchapter - Penalties. 2 Except as provided in §§ 20-22-603 and 20-22-613, no person may do any 3 of the following: 4 (1) Engage in the business of installing, inspecting, or 5 servicing portable fire extinguishers without a current certificate of 6 registration; 7 (2) Engage in the business of installing, inspecting, or 8 servicing fixed fire protection systems without a current certificate of 9 registration; 10 (3) Install, inspect, or service portable fire extinguishers or 11 fixed fire protection systems without a current individual license; 12 (4) Perform hydrostatic testing of any portable fire 13 extinguisher or any fire extinguisher system cylinder without a current 14 hydrostatic testing certificate; 15 (5) Obtain or attempt to obtain a certificate of registration or 16 individual license by fraudulent representation, fraudulent examination or 17 testing, misconduct, or irregularity; 18 (6) Sell, service, <u>inspect</u>, or install portable fire 19 extinguishers, fixed fire protection systems, or fire protection sprinkler 20 systems contrary to this subchapter or the policies formulated and 21 administered under the authority of this subchapter; 22 (7) Engage in any fire protection sprinkler system business 23 without a current certificate of registration and without employing a full-24 time licensed responsible managing employee; and 25 (8) Engage in the inspection of fire protection sprinkler 26 systems without employing a full-time licensed fire sprinkler systems 27 inspector; and 28 (9)(8) Engage in any business or activity licensed or permitted 29 by the Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board without maintaining in force at all times a public liability insurance policy, with minimum coverage 30 31 limits as set by the board, covering the person's operations and completed 32 operations. 33 34 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 20-22-610 is amended to read as follows: 35 20-22-610. License, permit, or certificate - Application - Fees. 36 (a) Applications for licenses, permits, and certificates provided for

in this section shall be made under policies adopted by the Arkansas Fire
 Protection Licensing Board and shall be submitted on forms prescribed by the
 board.

4 (b)(1) Each firm or person desiring to engage in or to continue to 5 engage in the business of installing, inspecting, or servicing portable fire 6 extinguishers, selling, inspecting, installing, or servicing fixed fire 7 protection systems, performing hydrostatic testing of fire extinguishers or 8 fire extinguisher cylinders, or planning, selling, installing, maintaining, 9 inspecting, or servicing fire protection sprinkler systems in the State of 10 Arkansas as a condition of engaging or continuing to engage in such a 11 business shall obtain from the board a certificate of registration and 12 appropriate individual licenses as prescribed in this subchapter.

13 (2) Each firm engaged in the business of installing or servicing
14 portable fire extinguishers or selling, installing, inspecting, or servicing
15 fixed fire protection systems shall obtain a certificate of registration and
16 shall pay the following fees:

17 (A) For engaging in the business of <u>inspecting</u>, 18 installing, or servicing portable fire extinguishers, the fee for the initial 19 certificate of registration shall be no more than five hundred dollars 20 (\$500), and the annual renewal fee shall be no more than five hundred dollars 21 (\$500); and

(B) For engaging in the business of selling, installing,
<u>inspecting</u>, or servicing fixed fire protection systems, the fee for the
initial certificate of registration shall be no more than five hundred
dollars (\$500), and the annual renewal fee shall be no more than five hundred
dollars (\$500).

27 (3) Each employee of a registered firm who engages in
28 installing, inspecting, or servicing portable fire extinguishers or selling,
29 installing, inspecting, or servicing fixed fire protection systems, other
30 than an apprentice, shall obtain an individual license and pay the following
31 fees:

32 (A) For a license to install, inspect, or service portable
33 fire extinguishers, an initial fee of no more than one hundred dollars
34 (\$100), and for each annual renewal thereof a fee of no more than fifty
35 dollars (\$50.00); and

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(B) For a license to sell, install, inspect, or service

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1 fixed fire protection systems, an initial fee of no more than one hundred 2 dollars (\$100), and an annual renewal fee of no more than fifty dollars 3 (\$50.00).

4 (4) Each firm performing hydrostatic testing of United States 5 Department of Transportation specification compressed gas cylinders used for 6 or with portable fire extinguishers or for or with fixed fire protection 7 systems, as a condition of engaging in such a business, shall obtain a Class 8 A hydrostatic testing certificate for which the initial fee shall be no more 9 than two hundred dollars (\$200), and an annual renewal fee shall be no more 10 than one hundred dollars (\$100).

(5) Each firm performing hydrostatic testing of pressure vessels used for or with portable fire extinguishers or for or with fixed fire protection systems, other than United States Department of Transportation specification compressed gas cylinders, shall obtain a Class B hydrostatic testing certificate as a condition of engaging in such a business, for which the initial fee shall be no more than one hundred dollars (\$100), and an annual renewal fee shall be no more than fifty dollars (\$50.00).

18 (6)(A) An employee of a registered firm who has been issued an 19 apprentice permit may sell, service, inspect, and install fire protection 20 sprinkler systems, portable fire extinguishers, and fixed fire protection 21 systems under the direct supervision of a licensed employee subject to rules 22 promulgated by the board.

(B) Each application for an apprentice permit shall be:
(i) Made by a registered firm; and
(ii) Accompanied by a fee of no more than thirty
dollars (\$30.00).

(C) A copy of the application may be used by the applicant as proof of a temporary permit until the official apprentice permit is issued or denied by the board.

30 (D) A copy of the application or the apprentice permit is31 valid for one (1) year from the date of issue and is not renewable.

(7)(A) Each employee of a registered firm desiring to take an
examination in order to obtain a license as required in this subchapter,
except a license for fire protection sprinkler systems, shall apply to the
board and pay an initial testing fee of no less than thirty dollars (\$30.00)
per examination nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100) per examination.

1 (B) Testing fees are to be paid each separate time an examination or series of examinations are is taken. 2 3 (8) Each firm engaged in a fire protection sprinkler business in 4 the state shall obtain a certificate of registration and shall pay the 5 following fees: 6 (A) An initial application fee not to exceed one hundred 7 dollars (\$100) for the certificate of registration; and 8 (B) A fee not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for 9 the issuance of either the initial certificate of registration or any annual 10 renewal of the certificate of registration. 11 (9) Each firm holding a certificate of registration for a fire 12 protection sprinkler system business shall at all times employ at least one 13 (1) responsible managing employee who must obtain a license issued by the 14 board after successful completion of the requirements in this subchapter and 15 under the rules of the board, including without limitation the passage of 16 examinations, and by payment of the following fees established by rule of the 17 board subject to the following limitations: 18 (A) An examination fee not to exceed two hundred dollars 19 (\$200) per examination to be paid each time an examination is taken for any 20 individual license issued by the board; and 21 (B) A license fee not to exceed five hundred dollars 22 (\$500) shall be paid for issuance of the initial license and each annual 23 renewal thereof for any individual license issued by the board. 24 25 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 20-22-611(a), concerning qualifications for a 26 license to sell, install, or service certain items related to fire 27 protection, is amended to read as follows: 28 (a) For a license to install or service portable fire extinguishers, 29 for a license to sell, install, or service fixed fire protection systems, or 30 for a license as a responsible managing employee or as a fire protection 31 sprinkler system inspector to conduct any fire protection sprinkler system 32 business, a person employed by a certified firm shall+ obtain a license 33 issued by the Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board after: 34 (1) Successful completion of the requirements for licensure 35 under rules of the board; and 36

(2) Payment of fees established under rules of the board.

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1	(1) Achieve a passing score on an examination based on the rules
2	adopted by the Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board;
3	(2) Be employed by a registered firm; and
4	(3) Pay all required testing and licensing fees.
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
