36	to add a new section to	read as follows:	

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1	14-54-905. Federal programs.		
2	An owner of an abandoned home or residential property that is located		
3	in a designated neighborhood stabilization or revitalization area may		
4	voluntarily participate in a United States Department of Housing and Urban		
5	Development's housing program if federal funds are available.		
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7	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
8	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that cities in Arkansas are facing		
9	a significant increase in abandoned homes; that these homes can be a strain		
10	on the cities and create unsafe conditions; and that this act is immediately		
11	necessary because federal moneys are available to assist cities to combat		
12	this problem. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act		
13	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,		
14	and safety shall become effective on:		
15	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
16	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
17	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
18	bill; or		
19	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
20	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
