SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 9, Subchapter 1 is amended to add a new section to read as follows:

12-9-116. Persons with disabilities training.
(a)(1) In accordance with the certification requirements of the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training for law enforcement officers, all new law enforcement officers in the state shall complete at least six (6) hours of training relating to persons with disabilities in a law enforcement context.
(2) Practicum training shall also be sufficient for the requirement under subdivision (a)(1) of this section.
(b) Training under subsection (a) of this section shall include without limitation:
(1) The dynamics of relating to a person with a disability;
