BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

WHEREAS, the state has an abundance of lignite, a soft brown fuel with characteristics similar to coal; and

WHEREAS, lignite has many potential uses, including without limitation being made into synthetic crude oil for transportation fuel, fuel for generating electricity, and synthetic natural gas; and

WHEREAS, lignite byproducts have potential value; and

WHEREAS, the mining of lignite would have a positive economic impact on this state and create new jobs; and

WHEREAS, the use of lignite would encourage energy independence; and

WHEREAS, research is needed to maintain a viable lignite industry and to enhance development of lignite uses; and

WHEREAS, lignite research needs funding,

NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Joint Committee on Energy is requested to make a study of lignite and to fund research to maintain a viable lignite industry in this state and to enhance development of lignite uses, including without limitation its use as a fuel for generating electricity, synthetic natural gas, and synthetic crude oil for transportation fuel, and for use of its valuable byproducts.
