27	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL		
28	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL		
29	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:		
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31	THAT the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of		
32	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state		
33	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives		
34	and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election		
35	adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of		
36	the State of Arkansas, to wit:		

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- 2 SECTION 1. Section 5 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 § 5. Regular and fiscal sessions Time of meeting.
- 5 (a) The General Assembly shall meet at the seat of government every 6 year.
- 7 (b) The General Assembly shall meet in regular session on the second 8 Monday in January of each odd-numbered year to consider any bill or 9 resolution. The General Assembly may alter the time at which the regular 10 session begins.
 - (e)(1) Beginning in 2010, the General Assembly shall meet in fiscal session on the second Monday in February of each even-numbered year to consider only appropriation bills. The General Assembly may alter the time at which the fiscal session begins.
 - (2) A bill other than an appropriation bill may be considered in a fiscal session if two-thirds (2/3) of the members of each house of the General Assembly approve consideration of the bill.
 - (d) The General Assembly, by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly, may alter the dates of the regular session and fiscal session so that regular sessions occur in even-numbered years and the fiscal sessions occur in odd-numbered years.

- SECTION 2. Section 17 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is amended to read as follows:
- § 17. Duration of sessions.
 - (a) A regular biennial session shall not exceed sixty (60) calendar days in duration, unless extended by a vote of two thirds (2/3) of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly. The regular biennial session shall not exceed seventy five (75) calendar days in duration, unless extended by a vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly.
 - (b) A fiscal session shall not exceed thirty (30) calendar days in duration, except that by a vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly a fiscal session may be extended one (1) time by no more than fifteen (15) calendar days. The regular biennial sessions shall not exceed sixty (60) days in duration unless by a vote of

Section 29 of Article 5 of the Constitution of Arkansas is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 § 29. Appropriations. 9 No money shall be drawn from the treasury except in pursuance of 10 specific appropriation made by law, the purpose of which shall be distinctly 11 stated in the bill, and the maximum amount which may be drawn shall be 12 specified in dollars and cents; and no appropriations made by the General 13 Assembly after December 31, 2008, shall be for a longer period period longer 14 than one (1) fiscal year two (2) years. 15 16 SECTION 4. Section 34 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 17 amended to read as follows: 18 § 34. Introduction of bills - Time limit. 19 No new bill shall be introduced into either house during the last three 20 days of a regular or fiscal session. 21 22 SECTION 5. Section 39 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 23 amended to read as follows: 24 § 39. State expenses - Limitation - Exceptions. 25 § 3. Excepting monies raised or collected for educational purposes, 26 highway purposes, to pay Confederate pensions and the just debts of the 27 State, the General Assembly is hereby prohibited from appropriating or expending more than the sum of Two and One Half Million Dollars two million 28 five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) for all purposes, for any fiscal 29 30 year biennial period; provided the limit herein fixed may be exceeded by the 31 votes of three-fourths of the members elected to each House of the General 32 Assembly. 33 34 SECTION 6. Section 40 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 35 amended to read as follows: 36 § 40. General appropriation bill - Enactment.
