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25	SECTION 1. A	rkansas Code § 24-2-401(2), concerning t	he definition for
26	"public safety serv	ice covered by the Arkansas Public Employ	ees' Retirement
27	System", is amended	to read as follows:

29	Employees' Retireme	nt System" means service as a public safe	ty member as
30	defined in § 24-4-1	01(34) and by a person who was employed p	rior to July 1,

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33	SECTION 2. A	rkansas Code § 24-4-101(34), concerning t	he definition of
34	"public safety members	er", is amended to read as follows:	
35	(34)(A)	"Public safety member" means a noncontr	ibutory member
36	whose covered employ	yment is for personal services as a polic	e officer or

- 1 firefighter and his or her employment commenced prior to July 1, 1997, except
- 2 as provided for public safety members covered under § 24-4-1004.
- 3 (B)(i)(a) "Police officer" means any regular or permanent
- 4 employee whose primary duty is law enforcement of a municipal police
- 5 department, a county sheriff's office, or the Department of Arkansas State
- 6 Police, including probationary police officers.
- 7 (b) "Police officer" includes wildlife
- 8 officers of the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission, drug enforcement
- 9 officers of a judicial drug taskforce, civilian employees of the State
- 10 Military Department covered under § 24-4-1004, and all officers and the
- 11 Director of the State Capitol Police within the office of the Secretary of
- 12 State.
- 13 (ii) An officer who, although assigned to
- 14 administrative duties, is still subject to call for service at patrol duty or
- 15 duty in the field or is subject to call for duties in emergency situations
- 16 requiring the officer to be armed with a firearm shall be considered to have
- 17 the primary duty of law enforcement for the purpose of this subdivision
- 18 (34)(B).
- 19 (iii) The term "police officer" shall not include
- 20 any civilian employee of a police department or any person temporarily
- 21 employed as a police officer during an emergency.
- 22 (C)(i) "Firefighter" means any regular employee of a fire
- 23 department whose primary duty is fire fighting, including probationary
- 24 firefighters.
- 25 (ii) "Firefighter" shall not include any civilian
- 26 employee of a fire department or any person temporarily employed as a
- 27 firefighter during an emergency.
- 28 (D)(i) "Public safety member" shall not include a member
- 29 whose employment as a police officer or firefighter commenced on or after
- July 1, 1997, except as provided for public safety members covered under §
- 31 24-4-1004.
- 32 (ii)(a) If a public safety member leaves his or her
- 33 employment as a police officer or firefighter for employment as a police
- 34 officer or firefighter in a position covered by the Arkansas Public
- 35 Employees' Retirement System, Arkansas State Highway Employees' Retirement
- 36 System, State Police Retirement System, or Arkansas Local Police and Fire

- 1 Retirement System and returns to his or her previous employment as a police
- 2 officer or firefighter, the public safety member shall resume receiving
- 3 credited service at one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the regular rate for
- 4 crediting service.
- 5 (b) A person eligible to resume receiving
- 6 public safety credit prior to July 31, 2007, shall receive credited service
- 7 for his or her return to employment as a police officer or firefighter at one
- 8 and one-half (1½) times the regular rate for crediting service.
- 9 (E) A public safety member who receives or has received
- 10 credited service at one and one-half ($l\frac{1}{2}$) times the regular rate for
- 11 crediting service may change employers and continue to receive credited
- 12 service at one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ times the regular rate for crediting
- 13 service, provided:
- (i) The person is employed as a public safety
- 15 officer within six (6) months of termination from employment as a public
- 16 safety member; and
- 17 (ii) The employer provides public safety officers
- 18 credited service at one and one-half (l_2) times the regular rate for
- 19 crediting service;

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- 21 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-4-521(b)(1), concerning credited service
- 22 of public safety member, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 (b)(1)(A) Noncontributory employment service by a person who was
- 24 employed prior to July 1, 1997, as a public safety member shall be credited
- 25 at one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the regular rate for crediting service, and
- 26 employment service by persons employed on and after July 1, 1997, shall be
- 27 credited at the regular rate for crediting service, except that at least five
- 28 (5) years of actual service shall be required to meet the retirement
- 29 eligibility requirements of \S 24-4-601 and 24-4-510 24-4-512, and at least
- 30 five (5) years of actual service shall be required to meet the eligibility
- 31 requirements of $\S 24-4-608$.
- 32 (B)(i) Noncontributory employment service by a person who
- 33 qualifies as a public safety member under § 24-4-1004 shall be credited at
- 34 one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ times the regular rate for crediting service.
- 35 <u>(ii) However, at least five (5) years of actual</u>
- 36 <u>service shall be required to meet the retirement eligibility requirements of</u>

1	§§ $24-4-601$ and $24-4-510 - 24-4-512$, and at least five (5) years of actual
2	service shall be required to meet the eligibility requirements of § 24-4-608
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4	SECTION 4. Arkansas Title 24, Chapter 4, Subchapter 10 is amended to
5	add a new section to read as follows:
6	24-4-1004. Determination of benefits for civilian employees of State
7	Military Department - Responsibility for additional costs.
8	(a) For purposes of determining benefits under this chapter, all
9	credited service, whenever earned, of persons employed as civilian employees
10	of the State Military Department as of July 1, 1997, and of persons
11	thereafter employed in those positions shall be treated as public safety
12	member service if the position is one hundred percent (100%) federally
13	funded.
14	(b) The additional cost to the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement
15	System as computed by actuarial determination is the responsibility of the
16	employer and is in addition to those costs required by §24-2-701(c).
17	(c) Employment as a public safety member shall be credited at one and
18	one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the regular rate for crediting service.
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
