- 23 <u>(4) Serve as a clearinghouse for information on issues</u> 24 pertaining to women;
- 25 (5) Advise the Governor and the General Assembly on the effect 26 on women of proposed legislation; and
- 27 (6) Promote and facilitate collaboration among local women's commissions and among women's organizations in the state.
- 29 (b) The commission shall report by October 1 of each even-numbered
