## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO CREATE THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.


#### Abstract

Subtitle TO CREATE THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN.


BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 84, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

20-84-201. Purpose.
The purpose of this subchapter is to create the Commission on the Status of Women to conduct ongoing studies of matters concerning women and to share these studies with other states that have created similar commissions.

20-84-202. Creation - Members.
(a) The Commission on the Status of Women is created.
(b) The commission shall consist of the following non-legislative
members:
(1) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor;
(2) Three (3) members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and
(3) Three (3) members appointed by the Speaker of the House of

## Representatives.

(c)(1) Of the initial appointees to the commission by the Governor:
(A) One (1) member shall serve a term of one (1) year;
(B) One (1) member shall serve a term of two (2) years;
and
(C) One (1) member shall serve a term of three (3) years.
(2) Of the initial appointees to the commission by the President

Pro Tempore of the Senate:
(A) One (1) member shall serve a term of one (1) year;
(B) One (1) member shall serve a term of two (2) years;
and
(C) One (1) members shall serve a term of three (3) years. (3) Of the initial appointees to the commission by the Speaker of the House of Representatives:
(A) One (1) member shall serve a term of one (1) year;
(B) One (1) member shall serve a term of two (2) years;
and
(C) One (1) member shall serve a term of three (3) years.
(4) Each succeeding appointment to the commission shall be for a term of three (3) years, but the member appointed shall serve until the member's successor is appointed.
(5) Of the initial members appointed by each appointing authority, the appointing authority shall determine which member serves a one-year term, which member serves a two-year term, and which member serves a three-year term.
(6) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled by the appointing authority for the unexpired portion of the term in which it occurs.
(d)(1) The Governor shall designate one (1) of his or her appointees to the commission to:
(A) Call the first meeting of the commission; and
(B) Serve as chair at the first meeting.
(2)(A) At the first meeting, the members of the commission shall elect from its membership a chair and a vice chair.
(B) The chair and the vice chair shall each serve for a
term of two (2) years.
(3) The commission shall conduct its meetings in Pulaski County at the State Capitol or via teleconference or web conference as technology
becomes available and as desired to allow for scheduling flexibility for its members.
(4) The commission shall meet at least quarterly or as decided upon by the commission.
(e) A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for transacting business of the commission.
(f) All state agencies shall furnish to the commission and its staff any information and assistance the commission or its staff may reasonably request.
(g) The members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation for their services but shall be reimbursed for any expenses incurred in the performance of their duties if non-state funds are available.

20-84-203. Duties.
(a) The Commission on the Status of Women shall:
(1) Study, review, and report on the status of women in

## Arkansas;

(2) Inform leaders of business, education, health care, state and local governments, and the communications media of issues pertaining to women;
(3) Serve as a liaison between government and private interest groups concerned with issues affecting women;
(4) Serve as a clearinghouse for information on issues
pertaining to women;
(5) Advise the Governor and the General Assembly on the effect on women of proposed legislation; and
(6) Promote and facilitate collaboration among local women's commissions and among women's organizations in the state.
(b) The commission shall report by October 1 of each even-numbered year beginning in 2012 to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives the results of its findings and activities and any of its recommendations.
(c)(1) The commission may accept and solicit funds, including gifts, donations, grants, or bequests, or any federal funds, to carry out its duties.
(2) The funds shall be deposited into a separate account with
