ARKANSAS 33 HEALTH CENTER. (A) The Department of Human Services shall not close the 34 Arkansas Health Center that provides skilled nursing through specialized 35 services and programs.

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(B) The Department of Human Services shall continue to accept clients for

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whom it has determined that skilled nursing and specialized services are
 needed at the Arkansas Health Center.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. Each Community Mental 3 4 Health Center shall contract with one or more facilities of its choice 5 (excluding Arkansas State Hospital) to provide the inpatient care for 6 indigent patients which the Community Mental Health Center has determined to 7 be necessary after prompt screening by the Community Mental Health Center. 8 Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health 9 Center who receive care at these inpatient facilities shall be provided to 10 the inpatient facilities at the contract rate unless the funds available for 11 this purpose have been exhausted. 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SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - PER CAPITA - LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The 20 21 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of 22 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago 23 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly 24 also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public 25 mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care. 26 The purpose of the Acute Mental Health Services - Per Capita appropriation is 27 to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services to be utilized 28 within community-based settings for the treatment and care of medically 29 indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary commitments to the 30 public mental health system. The appropriation for acute mental health 31 services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community Mental Health 32 Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral Health of the 33 Department of Human Services for use within community-based settings and 34 facilities.

The Division of Behavioral Health Services is 3 4 authorized to use administrative operating account for capital improvements 5 to the physical plant, and for the purchase of capital equipment, and for the 6 operation of the Arkansas Health Center, operated by the Department of Human 7 Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services. The funds shall be held by 8 the Department of Human Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services, 9 from the proceeds of the sale of timber and hay that may be harvested from 10 land owned by the Division of Behavioral Health Services. All funds deposited 11 and all expenses shall be tracked separately. The harvesting of timber and 12 hay is specifically authorized to provide funds to finance capital 13 improvements to the physical plant, for the purchase of major capital 14 equipment, and for the operation of the Arkansas Health Center. The Division 15 of Behavioral Health Services shall report all income derived from the sale 16 of timber and hay to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the 17 Legislative Council. Any contracts initiated for the harvesting of timber and 18 hay shall be submitted to the Review Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative 19 Council for prior review. All expenditures of funds derived from the sale of 20 timber and hay will be expended in accordance with relevant state purchasing 21 laws.

25 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE 27 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES EMERGENCY RESERVE FUND. Of the total amount 28 appropriated for Acute Mental Health Services - Per Capita, two hundred fifty 29 thousand dollars (\$250,000) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 2012 30 shall first be allocated and made available to the Little Rock Community 31 Mental Health Center for Acute Mental Health Services. The remaining five 32 million five hundred thousand dollars (\$5,500,000) appropriated for the 33 fiscal year shall be allocated and made available to the community mental 34 health centers within community-based settings on a per-capita basis. 35 36

SECTION 28. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

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1 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 2 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 3 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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10 SECTION 29. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 11 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 12 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 13 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 14 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 15 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 16 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 17 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 18

19 SECTION 30. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 20 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 21 22 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011 is essential to the operation of 23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 24 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm 25 26 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 27 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 28 29 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011. 30 31 32 33 34

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
