SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 3 4 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1 5 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated 6 Funding that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for 7 Special Needs Isolated Funding in Section 1 of this Act and shall be used 8 there for fully funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code 9 §6-20-604 on a pro rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro 10 rata basis is defined as providing each district qualifying for additional 11 funding under subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how 12 each district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional 13 funding amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and 14 appropriation remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of 15 Arkansas Code §6-20-604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the 16 provisions of Arkansas Code §6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the 17 available funds are exhausted. 18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

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2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The

1 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such 2 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 3 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 4 as is deemed necessary. 5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 6 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012. 7 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 9 10 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special 11 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide 12 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such 13 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are 14 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of 15 special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute 16 such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section. 17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 18 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012. 19 20 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 22 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each 23 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time 24 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 25 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the 26 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation 27 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State 28 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-29 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount 30 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public 31 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or 32 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public 33 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".

- 11 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.
- 12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
- 13 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

- 15 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
- 17 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval
- 18 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas
- 19 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to
- 20 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related
- 21 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however,
- 22 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than
- 23 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.
- Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
- 25 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
- 26 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
- 27 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
- 28 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
- 29 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
- 30 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently

Of the total amount of appropriation and funds 10 authorized herein to the Department of Education - for the Quiz Bowl each 11 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each 12 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -13 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the 14 Quiz Bowl. 15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 16 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012. 17 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 20 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education 21 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation 22 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal 23 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred 24 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for 25 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five 26 hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, and 27 one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year for the State History Day Competition, and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) each 28 29 fiscal year for a grant to the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants 30 to regional and the state science fairs. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 6 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item 7 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for 8 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school 9 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to, teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by 10 11 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based 12 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving 13 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be 14 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that 15 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be 16 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or 17 school district participating in the program. 18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 19 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012. 20 21 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 23 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT. Of the total amount appropriated for Professional 24 Development Funding, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) may be authorized by 25 the Commissioner of the Department of Education to be used by the Department 26 of Education to develop and implement statewide professional development 27 support systems for teachers that will benefit student achievement. 28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 29 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012. 30 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 33 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School 34 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any 35 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the

Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for

- 1 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the
- 2 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas,
- 3 Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the

 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OPEN10 ENROLLMENT VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS.
 - (a) Regardless of any provision of any law to the contrary, no internet, long-distance or virtual technology open-enrollment charter school shall receive state funding for more than five hundred (500) students.
 - (b) Regardless of any provision of law to the contrary, no school district shall receive state funding for the 2010-2011 2011-2012 school year for those students who are included in the district's average daily membership for the previous school year but who are attending any openenrollment charter school that uses internet, long-distance, or virtual technology as the primary method of teaching.

SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education to administer the program.

Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of

- 1 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
- 2 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
- 3 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
- 4 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
- 5 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary
- 6 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring

- 22 Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers.

- 24 National Education Association in accordance with that organization's
- 25 deadlines for submission for their report "Rankings and Estimates" which
- 26 includes state-by-state teacher salary comparisons.

- 30 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Arkansas Better

- 34 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized

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- The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the written request set forth in (1) above;
 - Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget Committee; and
 - (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution.

SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PUBLIC SCHOOL RETIREE HEALTH INSURANCE. The Employee Benefits Division of the Department of Finance and Administration may use up to eleven dollars and twenty cents (\$11.20) from each contribution made under Arkansas Code §6-17-1117 (a) to offset the cost of health insurance premiums to eligible members electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance program as a retiree.

Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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     the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
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     effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm
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     upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
     programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
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     being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
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     and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011.
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
