The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical 26 Sciences may designate up to forty-five percent (45%) of the regular gross 27 salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or 28 appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used 29 by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-30 31 404(b)(9).

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

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35 SECTION *35*. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INDIGENT

CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is
 hereby authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend
 provisions of Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of
 Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid
 from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction
 of reporting, as provided by Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
8 <u>2010</u> <u>2011</u> through June 30, <u>2011</u> <u>2012</u>.

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SECTION 36. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 10 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher 12 Education shall establish and maintain for the 2010-2011 2011-2012 fiscal 13 14 year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level 15 not to exceed \$293,550. These positions are to be used by the University of 16 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs 17 of the University during the 2010-2011 2011-2012 fiscal year exceed the 18 number of positions allocated to the University by the Legislature. The 19 University shall provide justification to the Arkansas Department of Higher 20 Education for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No 21 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific 22 positions are requested by the University, approved by the University Board 23 or their designee, and approved by the Legislative Council. Furthermore, the 24 Office of Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of Management Services 25 of the Department of Finance and Administration shall establish and maintain 26 for the 2010-2011 2011-2012 fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) career 27 service positions up to a Cl30. These positions are to be used by the 28 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal 29 services needs of the University during the 2010-2011 2011-2012 fiscal year 30 exceed the number of positions in a classification allocated to the 31 University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to 32 OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No 33 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific 34 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved 35 by the Legislative Council.

36 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is

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1 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 2 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly 3 4 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be 5 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 6 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in 7 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the 8 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary 9 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the 10 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 11 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of 12 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled 13 14 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 15 void.

16 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as 17 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be 18 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 20 <u>2010</u> <u>2011</u> through June 30, <del>2011</del> <u>2012</u>.

SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHILD AND 24 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be 25 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas 26 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract 27 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics 28 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family 29 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of 30 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and 31 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically 32 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health 33 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not 34 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and 35 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas 36 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-

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1 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas

2 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services 3 offered through CHFLI.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, <u>2010</u> <u>2011</u> through June 30, <u>2011</u> <u>2012</u>.

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7 SECTION *38*. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING 9 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences 10 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue, 11 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking 12 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2010
<u>2011</u> through June 30, 2011 <u>2012</u>.

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16 SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 18 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship 19 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and 20 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing 21 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such 22 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for 23 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
25 <u>2010</u> <u>2011</u> through June 30, <del>2011</del> <u>2012</u>.

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27 SECTION 40. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL 28 29 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging 30 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of 31 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support 32 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor 33 is authorized for the 2010-2011 2011-2012 fiscal year a pool of one thousand 34 five hundred (1,500) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These 35 positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences 36 in the event that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated

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clinical or research programs that are initiated during the 2010-2011 2011 2012 fiscal year require additional positions, either in title, in
 classification, or in number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the
 General Assembly in Section 1 of this Act.

5 These "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions may also be used 6 to properly classify positions when the University of Arkansas for Medical 7 Sciences does not have a vacant position available with the appropriate 8 title, grade, or salary level. The salary rates for these positions shall 9 not exceed the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position authorized by the General Assembly in Section 1 of this Act, as 10 11 governed by the uniform Classification and Compensation Act of 1969, §21-5-12 201 et seq., or its successor.

13 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to 14 access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in 15 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the 16 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the 17 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional 18 positions exists. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical 19 Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification of 20 allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" to 21 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher Education, and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for review. 22 23 The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles and salaries 24 of personnel who have been employed in positions established from this pool 25 and the source and duration of funds associated with the positions.

(c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests
continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as
established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

30 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state 31 agency is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished 32 by delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and 33 the maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly 34 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be 35 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 36 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in

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1 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the 2 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and 3 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization 4 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint 5 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the 6 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is 7 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the 8 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a 9 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 11 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

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SECTION 41. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ON-CALL 14 15 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires 16 17 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff 18 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day 19 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform <u>Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor</u>, or this act for the 20 21 appropriate compensation.

22 <u>The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,</u>
 23 2011 through June 30, 2012.

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25 SECTION 42. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 26 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 27 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 28 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 29 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 30 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 31 32 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 33 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 34 with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 43 LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General

1 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 2 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 3 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 4 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 5 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 6 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 7 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 8 9 SECTION 44. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 10 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 11 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011 is essential to the operation of 12 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 13 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 14 15 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm 16 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental

17 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act

18 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health

19 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011.
