7	(a) A firefighter who suffers from cancer resulting in death or total		
8	or partial disability is presumed to have developed the cancer during the		
9	course and scope of employment as a firefighter if:		
10	(1) The firefighter regularly responded:		
11	(A) On the scene to calls involving fires or fire		
12	fighting; or		
13	(B) To an event involving the documented release of		
14	radiation or a known or suspected carcinogen while employed as a firefighter;		
15	and		
16	(2) The cancer is known to be associated with fire fighting or		
17	exposure to heat, smoke, radiation, or a known or suspected carcinogen as		
18	described in subsection (b) of this section.		
19	(b) This section applies only to a cancer that may be caused by		
20	exposure to heat, smoke, radiation, or a known or suspected carcinogen as		
21	determined by the International Agency for Research on Cancer on or before		
22	January 1, 2011.

25	(a) This subchapter applies only to a firefighter who:		
26	(1) On becoming employed or during employment as a firefighter		
27	received a physical examination that failed to reveal evidence of the illness		
28	or disease for which benefits or compensation are sought using a presumption		
29	established under this subchapter;		
30	(2) Has been employed for five (5) or more years as a		
31	firefighter ; and		
32	(3) Seeks benefits or compensation for a disease or illness		
33	covered by this subchapter that is discovered during employment as a		
34	firefighter.		
35	(b) A presumption under this subchapter does not apply:		
36	(1) To a determination of a survivor's eligibility for

19	firefighter would otherwise be entitled to receive at the time the claim for		
20	benefits or compensation is filed.		
21	(f) This subchapter applies to a firefighter who provides services as		
22	an employee of an entity created by an interlocal agreement.		
23	(g) Subdivision (b)(4) of this section does not affect the right of a		
24	firefighter to present proof that an injury or illness occurred during the		
25	course and scope of employment.

27	14-1-404. Effect of presumption.		
28	Except as provided under § 14-1-403, a presumption established under		
29	this subchapter applies to a determination of whether a firefighter's		
30	disability or death resulted from a disease or illness contracted in the		
31	course and scope of employment for purposes of benefits or compensation		
32	provided under any employee benefit, law, or plan, including a pension plan.		
33			
34	14-1-405. Presumption rebuttable.		
35	A presumption under this subchapter may be rebutted through a showing		
36	by a preponderance of the evidence that a risk factor, accident, hazard, or
