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1 § 7-1-101, shall be declared by: 2 (1) Certificate of the chair and secretary of any convention of 3 delegates held within twenty-five (25) days of the Governor's letter 4 certifying vacancy; or 5 (2)(A) A special primary election called, held, and conducted in 6 accordance with the rules of the party. 7 (B) A special primary election may be called only if the 8 special primary election can be called, held, conducted, and certified and 9 certificates of nomination filed at least seventy (70) days before the 10 general election. 11 (b)(1) In case of a tie vote for the same office at a general primary 12 election, a vacancy in nomination for that office shall exist. 13 (2)(A) Nominees of a political party to fill a vacancy in 14 nomination resulting from a tie vote for the same office at a general primary 15 election shall be declared by certificate of the chair and secretary of an 16 appropriate convention of delegates held within twenty-five (25) days of the 17 Governor's letter certifying a vacancy. 18 (B) A convention of delegates shall be conducted in 19 accordance with the rules of the party. 20 (c)(1) When a vacancy in nomination occurs as a result of death or 21 when the person who received the majority of votes cast at the preferential 22 primary election or the general primary election notifies the state committee 23 of the political party of his or her intent to refuse nomination due to 24 serious illness, moving out of the area from which elected as the party's 25 nominee, or filing for another office, the state committee of the political 26 party shall notify the Governor within five (5) days after the date of death 27 or the date the party was notified of intent to refuse nomination as to whether the party chooses to fill the vacancy in nomination at a special 28 29 election or a convention. 30 (d) (2) If the party fails to notify the Governor within the five-day 31 period, the vacancy in nomination shall not be filled nor shall the vacancy 32 in nomination be filled if it occurred for any reason other than death, 33 serious illness, the candidate's moving out of the area from which elected as 34 the party's nominee, or filing for another office.

35 (e)(d)(1) If the party notifies the Governor within the time 36 prescribed in subsection (c) of this section of the desire to have a special

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1 primary election, the Governor shall issue a proclamation within five (5) 2 days calling the special election and establishing the deadline for filing as a candidate for nomination, drawing for ballot position, and issuing and 3 4 filing certificates of nomination. The special primary election shall occur no earlier than thirty (30) days nor later than sixty (60) days after the 5 6 filing deadline. The candidate who receives the most votes in the special 7 primary election shall be declared the nominee. There shall be no runoff 8 election. In the event of a tie for the most votes, the nominee shall be 9 determined by lot in a public meeting of the appropriate party committee.

10 (2) When the certificate of nomination is filed for a nominee 11 who is filling a vacancy in nomination, the filing authority shall 12 immediately certify the name of the nominee to the appropriate county board 13 of election commissioners.

14 (f)(e)(1) If the party notifies the Governor that it desires to fill 15 the vacancy in nomination by convention, the convention shall occur no later 16 than twenty-five (25) days after the notice is provided to the Governor.

17 (2) A convention shall be conducted in accordance with the rules
18 of the party.

19 (g)(1) If the party's nominee is not selected in time to file his 20 or her certificate of nomination with the appropriate party authority at 21 least sixty-six (66) days before the general election, the nominee's name 22 shall not appear on the general election ballot but the name of the person 23 who vacated the nomination shall appear on the ballot, and votes cast for the 24 name of the person appearing on the ballot shall be counted for the nominee 25 but only if the certificate of nomination is duly filed at least thirty-five 26 (35) days before the general election.

27 (2)(A) If votes for a nominee whose name does not appear on the 28 ballot are to be counted under subdivision  $\frac{g}{f}(1)$  of this section, the 29 county board of election commissioners shall post a notice at each affected 30 polling place stating each election in which a vote for the person appearing 31 on the ballot shall be counted for the nominee.
