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2	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the disallowance of a tax			
4	credit in Arkansas for the payment of sales tax in another state for the			
5	purchase of a motor vehicle, a trailer, or a semi-trailer has caused an			
6	unfair burden on the citizens of Arkansas. In order to correct this			
7	situation and to prevent a future unfair burden, the law should be			
8	implemented immediately. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and			
9	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public			
10	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:			
11	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
12	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
13	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
14	<pre>bill; or</pre>			
15	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
16	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.			
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
