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12	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-64-1103(d)(4)(B), concerning sales limits		
13	on ephedrine and similar drugs, is amended to read as follows:		
14	(B) The person making the sale shall require proof of age		
15	from the purchaser, unless from the purchaser's outward appearance the person		
16	would reasonably presume the purchaser to be twenty-five (25) years of age or		
17	older.		
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19	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 5-64-1105(2)(A), concerning the definitions		
20	of proof of age and proof of identity, is amended to read as follows:		
21	(2)(A) "Proof of age" and "proof of identity" means any document		
22	issued by a governmental agency the United States Government or its states or		
23	$\underline{\text{territories}}$ that contains $\underline{\text{a description of the person or}}$ a photograph of the		
24	person, or both, and gives the person's date of birth, the person's current		
25	address, and a functioning magnetic strip or bar code.		
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27	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 5-64-1111 is amended to read as follows:		
28	5-64-1111. Liability of pharmacy or pharmacist.		
29	(a) A pharmacy in this state is not liable civilly for a sale of		
30	ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine that occurs at another		
31	pharmacy in this state.		
32	(b) A pharmacy or pharmacist is not civilly liable for a determination		
33	made under § 5-64-1103(c) or for any refusal to dispense, sell, transfer, or		
34	otherwise furnish ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine based or		
35	a determination of age or identity.		

1	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 5, Chapter 64, Subchapter 11 is amended		
2	to add an additional section to read as follows:		
3	5-64-1113. Pharmacist-authorized drugs.		
4	(a) Upon recommendation of the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy, the		
5	Department of Health may adopt rules adding to a list of additional non-		
6	prescription drugs that are subject to the same restrictions as are imposed		
7	for ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine under § 5-64-1103(c)		
8	and (d)(4) and § 5-64-1104.		
9	(b) A pharmacy or a pharmacist has the same immunity from civil		
10	liability with regard to non-prescription drugs under subsection (a) of this		
11	section as is provided under § 5-64-1111 for actions concerning ephedrine,		
12	pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine.		
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
