To assist the General Assembly, there is established the "Joint 10 (a) 11 Interim Oversight Committee on Higher Education Reform" to be composed of the following members: 12

13 (1) Seven (7) members of the Senate to be appointed by the Chair 14 of the Senate Committee on Education, in consultation with the President Pro 15 Tempore of the Senate; and
