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1	immediate staffing needs in other areas of the agency; and that this act is		
2	immediately necessary because it will allow the Attorney General the		
3	flexibility to assign existing staff to work in other areas of the agency in

5	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
